

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- To the intense satisfaction of the Foreign Ministry Cambodia has opened an Embassy here -- the first Asian country to have an Embassy in Jerusalem rather than in Tel Aviv.

MONTREAL (WNS) -- Several hundred protestors joined nine presidents of leading Canadian Jewish organizations to form a human candelabra in front of Aeroflot, the soviet tourist agency, over the plight of Soviet Jews.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- A B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundations study of 80 college campuses has found only a "negligible percentage" of Jews attracted to fundamentalist appeals, although "some form of missionary activity" was reported at 50 of the schools.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israeli travellers returning from abroad reported they had been advised by several airlines and at various European airports to refrain from conversing in Hebrew and to other wise conceal their identity, as a security measure against terrorists.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Paul Zuckerman of Detroit, general chairman of the United Jewish Appeal, reported that the goal for the 1973 UJA campaign in the U.S. has been set at \$505 million which he described as American Jewry's "fair share" of the minimum 1973 budget of the Jewish Agency of \$758 million.

RIO DE JANEIRO (WNS) -- Two Jews, Jaime Lerner, was elected mayor of Curitiba, and Mrs. Helena Levin, became the first woman ever to be appointed as Dean of the Social Science Faculty of Catholic University in Rio de Janeiro.

LONDON (WNS) -- The more than 700 persons attending the 28th commemoration of the Warsaw Ghetto Uprising here, heard that "Anti-Semitism is still rampant in many countries."

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- More than 200 Jewish and Christian youths, most of them university students from area schools, staged an all-night vigil at the reflecting pool opposite the Lincoln Memorial on behalf of Soviet Jewry.

NEW YORK -- Henry Rosovsky of Newton, Mass., professor and former chairman of the Department of Economics at Harvard University, has been named chairman of the American Jewish Congress' Commission on International Affairs, it was announced by Rabbi Arthur Hertzberg.

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- Israeli Deputy Ambassador Jacob Doron urged the Arab States to take the refugee question "out of the field of useless oratory and polemics" and "approach it in a spirit of good will and cooperation."

BERKELEY, CALIF. (WNS) -- The Association of Arab-American University graduates fifth annual convention adopted a resolution saluting "the Palestinian freedom fighters" pledged to defend by lawful means their efforts to implement their rights, and denounced Israel, the "irresolution and hypocrisy" of the Arab governments and the Nixon Administration.

LOS ANGELES -- "Anti-Semitism in the Soviet Press" is the subject of a new audio-visual program dramatizing the plight of Soviet Jewry which is now available from the Pacific Southwest Office of the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith, 590 N. Vermont Ave., Los Angeles, Cal. 90004.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Avraham Shifran, who emigrated here last year after spending 10 years in Soviet prisons, claimed that Soviet authorities were planning to forcibly move Soviet Jews from their present homes to the Birobidjan Autonomous Region in Eastern Siberia on the Chinese border.

LAUSSANE, SWITZERLAND (WNS) -- Alfred Frauenknecht, a former employee of the Sulzer Company, licensed manufacturers of Mirage planes for the Swiss Air Force, faces a seven year prison term for the sale of the plans of the Mirage's "Atar" engine to Israel for \$200,000.

and in defense of the rights of human persons and especially of those who are the weakest and the most defenseless, namely the refugees from Palestine." The Vatican spokesman said that Mrs. Meir's visit had not been the object of any previous negotiations or confrontations and had only taken advantage of her trip to Paris.

The Israeli Prime Minister, was accompanied by the Israeli Ambassador in Rome, Emil Najjar. She spent nearly an hour and twenty minutes with the Holy Father in his private library. A Vatican statement said that she outlined Israel's desire for peace and illustrated Israel's attempts at reaching a peaceful solution to the Middle East conflict through negotiations.

She also discussed the upsurge of terrorism and mentioned the plight of various Jewish communities in certain parts of the world.

Mrs. Meir also called on the Italian President Giovanni Leoni, at the Quirinal Palace. Mrs. Meir is also due to meet with Italian Premier Giulio Andreotti.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The Mayor Of Hebron, Sheikh Mohammed Ali Jaabari, has warned Jordan not to interfere with plans to establish an Arab University in the West Bank.

AMSTERDAM (WNS) -- Piet Nak, a well-known member of the Dutch anti-Nazi resistance movement of World War II, has returned an Israeli medal to Ambassador Shimson Arab to protest the condition of "100,000 Palestinian refugees still living in camps under Israeli occupation."
