

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israeli Army Chief of Staff, Gen. David Elazar, described as the most massive and intense in recent months retaliatory attacks in which Israel claimed its jets shot down six Syrian MIG-21s and inflicted heavy damage on Syrian Army camps, radar stations and terrorist strongholds inside Syria.

He said if the Syrians seal their borders to terrorist incursions against Israel, Israel will observe the cease-fire, but will retaliate any
