We solicit your nominations of names of such physicians whose careers, in your judgment, reflect the kind of interests which would justify consideration for the Wisconsin Mai-monides Award. The Wisconsin award is modeled after a similar one created in 1965 for Spertus College of Judaica and Michael Reese Hospital of Chicago. They have been most cooperative in helping us with our program.

The name of Maimonides evokes and symbo-

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lizes a tradition in which the physician was not only an illustrious man of science, but also one interested in and at home in the humanities, philosophy, religion, etc. It is a tradition of which medicine can be proud and from which our entire society can draw strength and inspiration.

A special nominating committee has been created consisting of faculty members from the University of Wisconsin's Department of Hebrew and Semitic Studies, physicians, rabbis, to select the nominee. We are confident that there are many individuals who, because of their background, deserve serious consideration, and we look forward with great anticipation to your suggestions. 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
