JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Foreign Minister Abba Eban said Egypt, which during the last five years has tried every method except negotiations to end the Middle East conflict, should learn the lesson of the Vietnam cease-fire -- the power of patient negotiations.

In a lengthy foreign policy statement Eban told the Knesset Israel received "with bounding joy" president Nixon's and Hanoi's announcement of the cease-fire. He said Israel felt friendship and respect for all of the people of Vietnam and said Israe! would soon open an embassy in Saigon and that it had told Hanoi it wished for diplomatic relations with North Vietnam.

Eban said he thought a partial Suez Canal settlement was still the likeliest path to peace and noted recent statements by Secretary of State William P. Rogers and French president Georges Pompidou favoring that approach. He praised Jordan's King Hussein for recently renouncing force as a means to gain his ends.
