9 IRAQI JEWS MURDERED AND 500 THREATENED WITH EXTINCTION

HUSSEIN: ARABS ACCEPT ISRAEL, FEAR IS ISRAEL'S EXPANSION

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Some political analysts here believe Jordan's King Hussein now has enough political and diplomatic clout to accomplish a two-fold objective: convince the Administration it ought to pressure Israel into an early settlement with her Arab neighbors and to undermine Israeli Premier Golda Meir's meeting with Nixon.

These feelings were

engendered by his proposal for an ecumenical meeting on Jerusalem, reactivation of the Eastern Front, and his announcement that Jordan is willing to arrive at a peace settlement with Israel if the Moslem holy places in Jerusalem are placed under Jordanian control.

In an interview with The Times of London this weekend, Hussein said that the quarter century old struggle of the Arab States against Israel must come to an end.

Referring to Resolution 242, he said it "bids us to... accept not only the presence of Israel but an Israel enclosed behind secure and recognized borders. To this, Jordan and Egypt have agreed." The ruler added: "In Arab eyes, one force still has to be put behind the 1967 resolution (242), publicly and more strongly, is the influence of the United States on both Arab and Israeli. The Arab needs to know that American friendship toward Israel is limited to its preservation, not to expansion."

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Jacob Stein, chairman of the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations, said he learned from unimpeachable sources that nine Iraqi Jews, who had been in prison for some months, were recently murdered, and urged world governments to protest.

He also said the Iraqi government had seized the property of all its Jews through newly enacted regulations. He said the worsening situation threatens the total extinction of the remaining 500 Jews in Iraq.

Meanwhile, Rep. Edward I. Koch (D. N.Y.) has asked the World Bank to cease financial aid to Iraq until Jews who wish to emigrate are allowed to do so and those remaining are free from discrimination. "There are many middle-aged and elderly people who have lost their jobs, their businesses have been boycotted, their assets frozen and their religious observances viewed as acts of sedition," Koch said.

NEW YORK. The American Jewish Congress called on the Government of Iraq to confirm or deny a report that nine Jewish citizens of Iraq, imprisoned in Baghdad, have been "put to death."

In a telegram to Abdul Karim Al-Shaikhly, Iraqi Ambassador to the United Nations, the American Jewish Congress also called on Iraq to "publicly establish that the prisoners remain in safe custody and to provide immediate access to them by an impartial body such as the International Red Cross.

"Anything less will give credence to these reports and call forth upon your government the most severe condemnation for an act of barbarism and brutality that must shock the conscience of the world," the Congress message declared.

The telegram was signed by Judge Justine Wise Polier, vice president of the Congress.

JORDAN REACTIVATES EAST FRONT

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Jordan's agreement to join Egypt and Syria in reactivating the East Front and to place its forces under the overall command of Egypt's military commander-in-chief and War Minister, is less important for its immediate military consequences than for the motivation behind it, according to Israeli sources. Deputy Premier Yigal Allon and Defense Minister Moshe Dayan concurred that Israel would keep a close watch along the Eastern Front, but stressed there was no need to re-deploy Israeli forces or revise Israeli strategy at this time.

Egypt broke diplo-

matic relations with Jordan in 1971 after King Hussein's forces decimated Palestinian terrorists. Egyptian officials in Cairo said that Jordan's acquiescence to a revived Eastern Front was a prerequisite for a Jordanian - Egyptian reconciliation. According to reports from Cairo, Palestinian fedayeen would be re-admitted into Jordan under the agreement, but their activities and deployment would be under strict Jordanian Army control.

West Bank leaders also believe Jordan's agreement is a diplomatic move with little military significance though it may lead to further Jordanian restrictions,

Paul Price is entitled to his own strong views against granting full status to 18-year-olds in this gambling state of Nevada.

But when he supports his contention with "reported" sustaining opinion by the Gaming Commission and Gaming Control Board, if Paul had a cherry tree, a George Washington he "ain't". That's where we came in.

We refuse to remain silent when a newspaperman deliberately conveys false information to his readers. We have checked the item and as of this writing the gaming authorities have not expressed any opinion on the subject.

At the same time we have uncovered almost overwhelming support to give 18-year-olds full adult status, including the right to drink, gamble and become dealers. The issue is whether to conform with Federal law granting the right to vote and all of the ramifications that will be interpreted by the national ruling.

In Nevada, Assemblyman Zel Lowman is sponsor of Bill No. 66, which will give 18-year-olds full adult status, without qualification. Zelman's proposal kind of jumps the gun against an almost similar bill about to be proposed by the District Attorney's Young Citizen's Council, which was formed by D. A. Roy Woofter in 1971 for the purpose of increasing communication and understanding between youth and the authority structure.

Bill Willard of the D. A.'s Office informed us
