If you suffer partial or total disablement due to an accident at work, then workmen's compensation is payable to you. Should you be killed while at work, benefits are payable to your dependents.

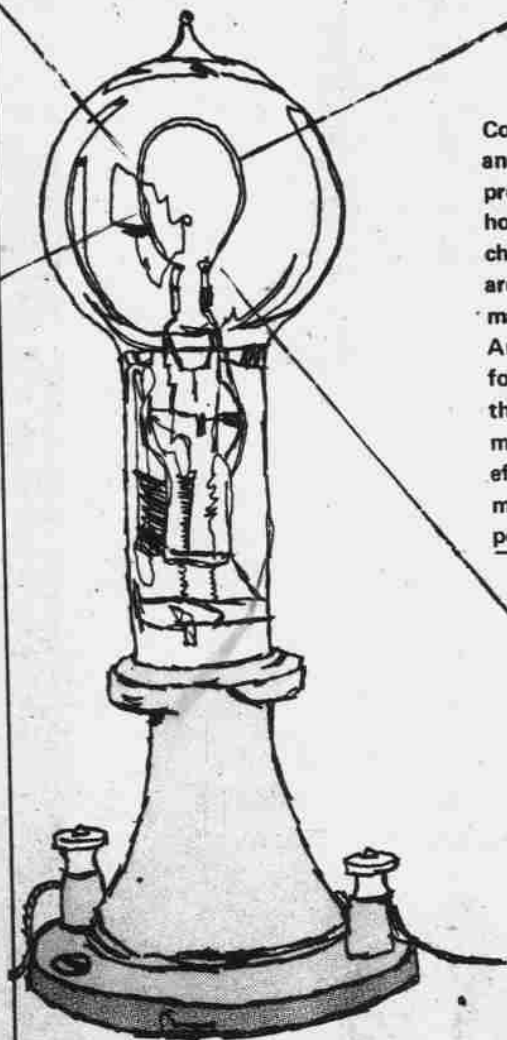
