

JEWISH AGENCY APPEALS FOR WORLD JEWRY HIGHER CONTRIBUTIONS

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Louis Pincus, chairman of the Jewish Agency Executive, and Arye Dulzin, Jewish Agency Treasurer, have both called for greater contributions from world Jewry at the Agency's second annual General Assembly here. Pincus said the Agency's proposed record 1973 budget of \$470 million is based on a

forecast of 70,000 immigrants this year, the majority from USSR. Dulzin said it fell well short of actual needs which he estimated at closer to \$785 million for the year, and warned of fateful consequences for Israel if fund-raising around the world is not even more successful in the future than it has been in the past.

Dulzin said the 1973 budget was only "provisional" with immigrant housing the largest item, though down \$30 million from last year. He said the budget has room for only 7-8000 units, while the arrival of new immigrants will require between 14-15,000. He expressed doubts that Israel was preparing itself properly for the anticipated influx of hundreds of thousands of Soviet Jews in the next decade and said \$10 billion will be needed in that time or "God forbid, we will fail."

The Treasurer criticized "the belief in Israel that aliya is too costly a burden for the society," and cited statistics showing immigrant contributions to the labor force and the gross national product during the last two years. Other items on the proposed budget included social welfare, health services, higher education, youth care and training.

Paul Zuckerman, United Jewish Appeal chairman, predicted the 1973 UJA effort would outdo the record-breaking campaign of 1972. Max Fisher of Detroit, chairman of the Agency's board of governors,

SOVIETS REFUSED 100,000 VISAS

GENEVA (WNS) -- Fifty leaders from 13 countries, including Israel and the United States met here to coordinate efforts to continue to press for action by the community of nations for the right of Soviet Jews to emigrate to Israel without the imposition of a "heinous ransom tax." Louis Pincus, World Zionist Organization chairman, said the rights demanded were "respected by all civilized nations" and "not only a Jewish right." He estimated that Soviet authorities have refused 100,000 applications for emigration to Israel.

In other developments Soviet authorities have turned down two appeals for amnesty for Sylvia Zalmanson Kuznetsov, who is serving a 10-year prison term after being sentenced at the first Leningrad hijacking trial Dec. 1970, it was reported in New York. Isak Skolnik, a compared the reconstituted Jewish Agency to a "Common Market" of Jewish resources, "an improved instrument for reaching out all over the world." Pincus was re-elected Agency chairman, and Dulzin was re-elected treasurer.
