WASHINGTON (WNS) -- "Commodore," the Israeli-built jet, recently renamed "Westwind", spanned the 2257 statute miles from Los Angeles to Savannah, Ga, in exactly four hours in a demonstration flight Feb. 4.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Foreign Minister Abba Eban denounced Jewish Defense League head rabbi Meir Kahane as a "demagogue" whose words and deeds ran counter to the Jewish spirit and created religious and political conflicts between Arabs and Jews.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Rabbi Bernard Bergmann, an American Mizrachi leader, speaking on his behalf and for Rabbi Avigdor Tsipperstein of the U.S. and Rabbi Tibor Rosenbaum of Switzerland, urged Israel not to return any part of the West Bank to the Arabs,

BONN (WNS) -- A Foreign Office spokesman has ruled out for domestic budgetary reasons any possibility of West German help to finance the Vienna-Tel Aviv airlift for Soviet Jewish immigrants.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Twenty-six more suspects, including four Jews, in the Syrian-directed espionage ring here were brought to Haifa district court and remanded for trial scheduled to start March 11.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Avraham Shenker de-cried the "impoverishment of ideological life" in the World Zionist Movement in a speech to the Zionist General Council (Actions Committee) and proposed "permanent mobile seminars" to tour Jewish communities abroad under local Zionist federation auspices.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Rear admiral (Res.) Yochai Bin Nun, former commander of the Israeli Navy and now general manager of the Israeli- Oceanography and Linological Research Co., has warned that the Mediterranean, especially its eastern shores, was more pollutionprone than any other major body of water and urged Israel to take drastic action to save its fishing ground and beaches,

WASHINGTON, D. C. -- The Jewish War Veterans of the U. S. A. sharply condemned those in charge of the Armed Forces Radio Network for permitting the notorious hatemonger Gerald L. K. Smith to harangue members of the Armed Forces over its stations.




