WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Israel Premier Golda Meir's meetings with President Nixon and top U. S. officials ended with the Premier's announcement that Israel has a friend in the White House and apparent satisfaction that no pressure would be put on Israel regarding a peace settlement. It was understood in Israeli circles here that Mrs. Meir was not asked to take any measures to open any new activities regarding Middle East affairs. High level diplomatic circles believed there had also been no change in the positions of Jordanian King Hussein or Egyptian President Anwar Sadat.

White House press Secretary Ronald Ziegler said Nixon "assured" Mrs. Meir "of continuing U. S. support" for Israel during their 90-minute talk at the White House March 1, and that the President felt the meeting was "very constructive". The White House spokesman stressed that it would be "inadvisable to expect any easy or instant or immediate results. The question, however, remains one of what we can contribute to moving toward peace in the area."

Mrs. Meir received a standing ovation at the National Press Club after addressing 400 news media representatives and responding to a long series of questions on various topics. Referring to the Sinai tragedy, Mrs. Meir reiterated it had

Price Hatches Haze

We have been asked if we have any malice against Paul Price. The answer is definitely no. Nor do we have any malice against Hank Greenspun, Price's boss on the Las Vegas Sun. There is no room in our makeup for malice, hatred, scorn or jealousy.

We would just as soon spring to the defense of Price and Greenspun with all the strength and talent of our writing ability, if we felt they were being maligned without justification.

The only reason we have been pointing out the fallacies in the writings of Paul Price during the past several years, is because if we don't, the corruption and greed and/or reporting for personal gain, would never be known to Vegas readers. Most important is our attempt to clear the record for innocent victims of this journalist rapist, who accuses without justification, and then refuses to correct the false impression even after proof is submitted.

This is exactly what happened recently when Price charged that four duly elected assemblymen could have been disqualified under the Federal Hatch Act. The net result certainly will affect their political futures in the years to come by creating confusion and doubt in the minds of voters.

Attached to the letter were photostatic copies, one of a statement dated July 18, 1972 (prior to the November election) from County Administrator David Henry to James Banner: "It is the opinion of this office that your interest in seeking public office as an Assemblyman is proper. The District Attorney's Office has also so ruled."

Another photostatic copy was a newspaper article that appeared after Price's column of condemnation. The article quoted Deputy District Attorney George Ogilvie, who stated unequivocally: "Three Clark County employees, who are on leave from their regular jobs to serve in the State Assembly following their

TERRORISTS MURDER 3 ENVOYS

JERUSALEM (WNS) --Several hours after the announcement that eight black September terrorists who murdered two American diplomats and one Belgian envoy in Khartoum March 2 had surrendered to Sudanese authorities, the Israel government urged other governments "not to surrender to extortion by terrorist organizations" if terrorist outrages are to be curbed.

Earlier Foreign Minister Abba Eban sent a brief message of condolence to U. S. Secretary of State William P. Rogers over the deaths of American Ambassador Cleo A. Noel, Jr. and U.S. Embassy Counsel-

or George C. Moore. The Cabinet statement contained additional condolences to the American and Belgian governments.
