BY RABBI SAMUEL SILVER There's a marveous publication, designed for young people but just as delightful to adults who read it; it's called "World Over," and is published by the Jewish Education Committee, Its editor, Dr. Morris Epstein, is one of those scholarly people who dispenses the, fruits of his learning with finesse and casualness.

The articles in "World Over" are most illuminating, and frequently its poesy is charming. As a sampler, here is a poem which talks about the fact that every Hebrew name has a meaning. It not only underscores the fact that a lot of people talk Hebrew even though they do not know it, but that more and more Americans are becoming familiar with the language of our forefathers and the language of our brothers "over there" in Israel; it's by Georgette Weiser:

Hebrew names have special meanings, Just as names do everywhere; We can hear the ancient music In the names we proudly bear. Hannah is "a favored daughter," David means "beloved one" Reuben means "to see a son," Judith is "the thanks we offer." Sarah is the name for 'princess," Simon means "the Lord has heard." Solomon is "peace forever," Hayyim means "life", a precious word. Gabriel is "strength from heaven," Rachel: "ewe who graced the sod," Meyer: "light," and Noah, "pleasant," Michael: "he who is like God." Jonathan, "the Lord has given," Nathan, "he who always gave," Eve is "mother of all living," And Elisha: "God shall save."
