FBI FOILS ATTEMPT TO BLOW UP ISRAELI INSTALLATIONS IN NYC

EBAN SAYS ISRAEL'S STRATEGY "VINDICATED"

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Foreign Minister Abba Eban said Israel's international strategy has been "vindicated" because it has tried to show the Arabs that negotiations are the only fruitful way of reaching a modus vivendi in the Middle East, and that Israel will continue to try to "close the options" of the Arabs in order to bring them to the peace table.

"I don't think they (the Arabs) will ever explore the limits of Israel's flexibility except by ne-

gotiations, just as we won't explore the limits of Arab moderation" except at the peace table, Eban said.

Referring to Israel's attitude towards a peace settlement, Eban said "A majority of us" feel that some territorial compromises are in order but there is a strong feeling that the peace settlement should not "re-establish the situation that led to war in the first place," an allusion to the Golan Heights and Arab demands for a division of sovereignty in Jerusalem.

WILL GOLDA MEIR RETIRE?

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Premier Golda Meir's remarks on CBS-TV "Face The Nation," that her political future would be decided by her party, caused Israelis to ponder whether she plans to remain in office after this year's national elections.

The Labor Party leadership, fearing a bitter struggle for succession, has been urging Mrs. Meir to stay on. Party officials took her statement as an indication that she intends to do so and called it "a very valuable decision."

The newspaper Maariv reported that she telephoned her party colleagues from New York to tell them her remark was for foreign consumption and that she firmly intends to

ISRAEL'S ECONOMY FAVORS RICH

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Histadrut Secretary General Yitzhak Ben Aharon has charged that Israel's economic policies were polarizing the nation between rich and poor, and had produced "socialism in reverse by expropriating public funds for the enrichment of a few."

He claimed the policies "endanger our very existence... We are living in an unreal situation created out of Hollywood..."

He demanded that the Labor Party, of which he is a leader, decide whether it wants a capitalist, acquisitive society or socialism, because "there can be no co-existence."

NEW YORK (WNS) -- An attempt to blow up two Israeli installations here were foiled by the quick action of the FBI, local police and Israeli security agents.

At the same time, a letter bomb mailed to a prominent Jewish journalist here from Athens was turned over to postal authorities. The FBI, which was investigating the incident, declined to comment on any aspect of the case.

The Police Department and its bomb squad division and the FBI were also maintaining strict silence about the two cars found March 8 with explosive devices,

one in front of the Israeli Discount Bank on Fifth Avenue, the other near the El Al freight terminal at Kennedy Airport. Both cars had been rented from car rental agencies, but the identity of the agencies and the persons renting the cars has not been released officially. Full-scale investigations are being conducted.

Police said the cache in the car near the El Al terminal consisted of two plastic bags of explosives, three five-gallon plastic containers of gasoline and three 20 pound bottles of propane gas.

ARAB - JEWISH SPY SENTENCED

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Haifa District Court Judge Emmanuel Slonim imposed a three-year prison term--the first sentence in connection with the Syrian-sponsored Arab-Jewish spy ring -- on Ahmed Mahmoud Hawari, 40, of Western Galilee for failing to inform authorities of the spying although he knew of its existence.

Hawari, who was tried

separately from the other defendants, said he failed to notify the police because the alleged ring-leader Daoud Osman Turki threatened that terrorists would blow up his house if he informed.

Meanwhile, the prosecuting attorney, summing up the State's case, demanded guilty verdicts on all counts against the six key defendants.

Dems got a Winner

Chairman of Democratic National Committee Robert S. Strauss, Chairman of Temple Bd. of Trustees, spent one hour in private session with Israeli Premier Golda Meir recently in Washington, he confided to the ISRAELITE in Las Vegas.

"It was the most gratifying time I ever spent," he said.

In town for a meeting with Democratic State chairmen, Strauss told a press conference, "no comment" when asked whether his party will support the genocide legislation.

Strauss was firmly in favor of the Equal Rights Bill (destined a loser in Nevada), and stated we needed laws for re-assurance of Freedom of the Press.

"The Democratic Party has no views on 'amnesty' because it was too far down on the priority list, which is topped by getting jobs for veterans."

Strauss commended President Nixon for ending the Vietnam War, but blasted the Chief Executive for arrogant fiscal manipulations. "It is the first time in history a President has impounded funds on so large a scale," he complained, "curtailing hospital beds and stopping many medical research programs."

The national chairman is on a country-wide tour to bring the Democratic Party together, to eliminate, "the bitterness, rancor, even hate."

A Hubert Humphrey man from away back,
