they prayed for such release from Egypt, they meant escape from he arms of Roman oppressors. As recently as three decades ago, the petition was for deliverance from Hitler.

This year, we have sad reason to lift our voice at Pesach time in appeals for the deliverance of the small, besieged Jewish community in Iraq for release from cruel tormentors.

How tragic the lot of our brothers and sisters in Iraq! The world's oldest Jewish community outside Israel, the Jewish enclave of Iraq held 120,000 Jews at the time of the rebirth of the State of Israel. By May, 1967, after the in-gathering, only 2500 remained. Then the so -called Six Day War visited severe repercussions on the demmunity. In February, 1968, out of Baghdad went forth the decree that the department of Land Registration was henceforth to abstain from carrying out any transactions regarding the "immovable properties" of Iraq's ancient Jewish community.

Expropriation of Jewish holdings became the order of the day. Jews of Iraq found it diffi-cult, if not impossible, to get jobs. Then, General Ahmad Hasan al-Bakr, who had been hoisted to the Presidency of Iraq by leftist revolutionaries, began to grind the faces of Iraq's Jews with even greater force and less mercy. Charges of spying for Israel were filed; and on Jan. 27, 1969, the world was shocked to learn that nine Jews, together with five Moslems and Christians, were hanged in the public square.

In recent weeks, a new chapter of persecu-tion and execution of the pitiful remnant of Iraq's Jews has been entered in the book of infamous deeds. One Jew who managed to escape the current genocidic madness has reported that in all likelihood 10 more Jews who were arrested have been hanged. Of the 700 Jews remaining from that noble, long line of Iraq's Jewry, half have appealed for visas to leave. The government has taken once more to expropriating Jewish pro-perty. Between \$150,000,000 and \$200,000,000 worth of Jewish hospitals, schools, businesses, and residences apparently have been snatched by a hostile government.

Against this mournful backdrop of injustice, murder, and confiscation, the government of Iraq has cynically declared that Jews in that tormented land continue to enjoy full rights and free-
