TERRORISTS INVOLVED IN MUNICH MASSACRE SLAIN BY ISRAELI RAID

TERRORISTS STALLED

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- El Fatah radio in Beirut issued urgent orders to terrorists to lay low for the time being, presumably because of Israel's capture of vital terrorist documents at terrorist headquarters in Beirut raided by

Israeli commandoes on April 10. At least 35 West Bank Arabs have been detained since the raid, and security sources indicated that more arrests could be expected.

According to one source, the seizure of the documents may have served to prevent attacks and sabotage planned by the terrorists to coincide with Israeli Independence Day celebrations. It was also learned that several Israeli Arabs living in northern Israel were detained as a result of information gleaned from the captured documents. Circles close to the military government said there were signs of chaos and fear among terrorists in the administered territories.

Chief of Staff Gen. David Elazar said Israel's policy of defensive - offensive action against the terrorists instituted last December has had a cumulative effect. He said there has been a significant decline in terrorist acts and a noticeable drop in terrorist organization membership, from 20,000 to 10 - 11,000 men.

Israelite Ads Pay

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israeli paratroopers and commandos raided the homes and headquarters of Arab terrorists in Lebanon April 9, killing three guerrilla leaders. The raid, a combined operation with the Navy and Air Forces in which two Israeli soldiers were killed and two wounded, came on the heels of Arab terrorist attacks on the Israeli Ambassador's residence in Nicosia, Cyprus and on an Israeli airliner at Nicosia Airport. Of the nine terrorists who took part in both assaults, one was killed, four wounded, three captured and one escaped. The Embassy residence was damaged and some damage was done to the Israeli plane.

Israel's Chief of Staff Gen. David Elazar said the raiders destroyed the headquarters of the Khuwarmen "Democratic Front" terrorist group in Lebanon. The Arabs killed were identified as Abu Yusuf Najar, described as El Fatah's No. 2 leader; Kamal Nassar, a Fatah leader and spokesman; and Jamal Adwan, believed responsible for planning terrorist activities inside Israel. He said all were involved in the preparation of the Munich massacre last Sept. 5. The Israelis, he said, had eight targets, seven in Beirut and one in Sidon where Fatah had a garage to maintain and service its vehicles. Other places hit in the raid included workshops where the terrorists had been preparing their bombs and other destructive devices sent to Europe elsewhere.

Premier Golda Meir praised the raids in a speech to the Knesset saying the raiders had attacked terrorists who had killed before and were planning to kill again. Israeli sources said the raid was ordered after an intensification of terrorist activities in Europe and elsewhere, and cited "at least" nine major incidents which they said had originated in the Beirut terrorist organization.

In Washington, the State Department deplored the raid. A United Nations spokesman said Secretary General Kurt Waldheim also deplored these "new acts of violence" in Cyprus and Lebanon.

ARABS URGED TO KILL AMERICANS

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- The State Department has protested to the Algerian government for permitting the Voice of Palestine Radio there to exhort Arabs to kill Americans.

Department spokesman Charles Bray said the VOP radio called on "Arab masses to strike everywhere" at United States interests and embassies and kill and assassinate everyone who is American." The department also sternly advised Arab governments to immediately stop allowing their official media facilities to spread the "big lie"

invented by Palestinian Arab groups that the U. S. had assisted Israel in its raids.

Additional precautions are being taken to safeguard American property and lives in Arab countries against violence which might stem from the emotional upsurge over the raid and alleged U. S. complicity.

Lebanon was reported as being the only country to have taken measures against attacks on U. S. buildings and personnel.
