

**JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS**

**UNITED NATIONS (WNS)** -- Lebanon called for an emergency Security Council meeting over Israel's commando raids April 10 on Arab terrorist headquarters in Beirut.

**NEW YORK (WNS)** -- Israel's new Ambassador Simcha Dinitz vigorously defending his nation against charges of militarism, said the April 10 commando raids on El Fatah headquarters in Beirut were intended to teach the terrorists they are not safe even in Arab countries.

**TEL AVIV (WNS)** -- Yugoslav authorities' insistence that the Israeli table tennis team depart from the world championship tournament in Sarajevo, Yugoslavia, because they could not guarantee their protection against possible terrorist attacks, has disappointed and angered Israelis.

**NEW YORK (WNS)** -- The Federal Equal Employment Opportunity Commission and the United States Attorney in Manhattan are suing the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company with "unlawful employment practices which discriminate against Jews and other minority group members."

**NEW YORK (WNS)** -- The National Committee for the Furthurance of Jewish Education has filed suit in U. S. District Court against Long Island's largest daily newspaper, Newsday, for its refusal to accept an advertisement denouncing intermarriage by Jews.

**BUENOS AIRES (WNS)** -- The Argentine Association of Jewish Survivors has hailed the Argentine government's decision to allow West Germany to extradite to Bonn former Nazi Joseph Schwammberger, 61, who has been living in Argentine since 1949.

**NEW YORK (WNS)** -- The Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith has charged three major Japanese companies with "concealing their long-time participation in the Arab economic boycott of Israel from American consumers because they fear the effect of the truth on their sales."

**LONDON (WNS)** -- Ahmed Anis, director of the Arab League Office here, has warned that the Jewish National Fund's presentation to Prince Philip of a volume recording the planting of a million tree forest near Nazareth in honor of his and Queen Elizabeth II's 25th wedding anniversary would put a severe strain on Anglo-Arab relations.

**NEW YORK (WNS)** -- Sixteen Israeli scholars and journalists, who spent two weeks each in 15 cities as "scholars in residence" say they now have a more positive view of the American Jewish community and find more similarities than diversities between American Jews and Israelis.

**PHILADELPHIA** -- The study tour on the Holocaust which is to be given this summer under the auspices of the Political Science and Religion Departments of Temple University to run from June 8 through July 23, is designed to provide students - undergraduate, graduate, and a limited number of auditors -- with the opportunity of studying Nazi destruction of European Jewry by providing access to the specialized archives that have been gathered in England, Holland, Germany, Austria and Israel. **NEW YORK (WNS)** -- Mordechai Ben-Ari, president of El Al Airlines, told Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations that El Al expects to triple in size by 1982 and become a complete round the world carrier. Ben-Ari is in the U.S. to negotiate landing rights for El Al in Philadelphia, Boston, Chicago, Miami and Los Angeles.

**JERUSALEM (WNS)** -- Judy Silver Shapiro, the Cincinnati social worker, and Gavriel Shapiro, the Jewish engineer activist she married in Moscow last June, are believed to have separated, according to reports here.

**NO LAND FOR JEWS IN HELD AREA**

**JERUSALEM (WNS)** -- Premier Golda Meir told the Knesset she decided to uphold the ban on individual land purchases in the administered territories after seeing the list of applications from private persons for permission to buy Arab lands and watching the prices "leap upward" during the two weeks of nationwide debate on the subject.

She categorically denied claims that she was pressured by Washington to change her mind.

She admitted she was reluctantly prepared to go along with a compromise, offered by Justice Minister Shimshon Shapiro, that would have permitted Jews to pur-

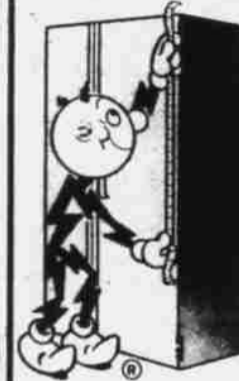
chase Arab land under strict government supervision and license requirements. She stressed that settlement on government-purchased land was going ahead as planned, and noted that 45 settlements have been set up so far in the territories.
