His proposals ap-peared to be asking for more presidential power over trade than any other American president in history to help meet the competition U. S. industry faces on overseas markets.

But he offered Congress a compromise in the form of a veto on the issue of granting mostfavored nation status. Nixon said he would notify Congress at least 90 days in advance of concluding an agree-ment and if neither the House nor the Senate moved to block it, it would go into effect.

As soon as the President's request reached Congress. Sen. Henry M. Jackson (D. Wash.) introduced the legislative measure bearing his name that would withhold most-favored nation status from any country that denies its citizens the right to emigrate and which imposes more than nominal emigration fees.
