City Commissioner and Mayor Pro Tem Hank Thornley filed for re-election with a pledge to continue to improve recreational facilities, battle pornography, and achieve cost-saving consolidation of government services.

Thornley, a veteran television newsman and commentator, seeks return to an at-large seat on the commission.

In his campaign, Thornley said, he will stand on his record of accomplishment.

"Over the past four years 15 new playgrounds and parks have been installed," the commissioner said. That's a good track record -- and we're going to do better."

Thornley also noted construction of the new city hall facilities launched during his initial term.

"We're going to continue to fight the battle against pornography and smut merchants," Thornley said. "The courts have tied our hands, but the trend is changing and this is one fight I'm into up to the end."

Thornley will actively pursue consolidation of government services, particularly in the vital law enforcement and fire protection areas. "The taxpayers want and deserve it," he said, "and the present commission has moved toward this goal with more determination than any in Las Vegas history."

The past vice-chairman of the regional Streets and Highways Commission vowed to solve the traffic congestion problem in downtown Las Vegas. He termed it "a high priority matter demanding a hard look and then firm, decisive action."

Thornley, who initiated the campaign practice of refusing to post small roadside and yard signs, said he would continue to "keep Las Vegas free of this kind of litter."

The commissioner commented on his qualifications. "I think it counts that I have exper-

ience. But more than that I'm available to the citizens. My number's listed and I've never been too big nor too busy to talk to anyone."

Thornley's career as a broadcast journalist spans more than 25 years. He came to Las Vegas in 1962 to organize and direct the news department of KLAS-TV. When he was elected to the city commission in 1969 Thornley was the first TV newsman ever elected to public office in Nevada.

Thornley and his wife, Marian, are parents of five children and reside at 2209 El Greco St.

CARL LOVELL FOR CITY ATTY.

Twenty-eight year old Las Vegas Attorney, Carl Lovell launched his campaign for Las Vegas City Attorney. After officially filing for the May 8th election race, Lovell said he would wage a vigorous campaign on the issues of pornography, obscenity, consumer protection, environmental control, and a more professional public-oriented City Attorney's Office.

Lovell, a 23-year resident of Clark County, has been serving as Chief Legal Counsel for the City of North Las Vegas and has performed the duties of acting City Manager of North Las Vegas during the absence and leave of the City Manager since 1970.

He is also presently serving as Chairman of the Nevada Young Democrats and in addition to his regular City of North Las Vegas duties, teaches business law at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas.

Lovell said the issue of widespread pornography and obscenity caught his attention long before he wrote a new obscenity law for the Nevada Legislature to allow local governments the power to control adult book stores and theatres. Lovell worked closely with the Nevada U. S. Attorney's Office and the F.B.I. to close the only adult book store then operating in North Las Vegas. Since then he pointed out that there are no x-rated movie houses operating in North Las Vegas and no further book stores selling pornography.

Lovell said he favored improvements in the Las Vegas City Attorney's office by hiring full-time attorneys who would limit private practice and be available for public business at all times instead of the present practice. Lovell noticed that the present City Attorney has increased staff attorneys by more than one hundred and fifty per cent in the past 5

years. And that the Las Vegas City Attorney's Budget has jumped from 131 thousand dollars in 1969 to nearly 400 thousand dollars in 1973.

I believe, he said, that with full-time attorneys we can do more public business at less cost.

Lovell also pointed out the office of City Attorney should be closely aligned with law enforcement agencies including the Las Vegas Police Department. Lovell said he favored, for that reason, City Attorneys working on regular shifts with police officials, from desk sergeants to patrolmen.

Lovell is married and he and his wife, Irene, have three children, 5-year old Tre, 3-year old Timmy, and 1-year old Tisha. The Lovells reside at 1230 Rancho Dr. in Las Vegas.

Lovell, in addition to his law partnership in the firm of Lovell & Schofield is a member of the Legislative Advisory Board to the State Legislature, General Counsel for the U. S. Federal Local Housing Authority, General Counsel for the Redevelopment Agency of North Las Vegas and is a member of the Las Vegas Chamber of Commerce; serving on its University Committee since 1969.

Mrs. Lovell, a former Junior High School Economics teacher, is active with the Las Vegas Attorney Wives club and the National Home Economics Association.
