

Finally, we have a splendid self-history by rabbi. He's Dr. Stanley Brav, of Temple Shalom, in suburban Cincinnati, and his book is called "Dawn of Reckoning," published by his congregation.

A sixtieth birthday present to himself, Rabbi Brav's book is a thrilling account of a busy life. Influenced by a Conservative rabbi, Max Klein, of Philadelphia, trained in Cincinnati at the Hebrew Union College, Rabbi Brav has had an across-the-board career. He was once a young assistant in a big congregation (that of the late Dr. David Lefkowitz St., in Dallas), then with a small temple in Vicksburg, Miss., then an associate rabbi at Rockdale Avenue Temple, Cincinnati, and finally, with a temple which he helped to found, where he still is cozily enconced.

A staunch pacifist, Rabbi Brav refused to get into uniform even in the face of Hitlerism. He tells why in his book. An early visitor to Palestine, he was resisted enrollment in Zionist ranks and he tells why.



SSIAN JEW GETS ID YEARS NEW YORK (WNS) ---In the harshest sentence to be metered out since the 1970 Leningrad hijack trial, Isaac Shkolmik, a 37-year old Jewish mechanic in Vinnitsa, Ukraine, was sentenced April 11 to ten years imprisonment on charges of treason and anti-Soviet propaganda, the National Conference on Soviet Jewry reported.

The NCSJ said Shkol-

nik's defense attorney warned him to confess to the charges or he would be sentenced to death.

The original charge of spying for Britain was changed shortly before the trial to spying for Israel. Shkolnik, who had applied for a visa for Israel, went on trial March 29 in a closed courtroom set up in a local brick factory. Israelite Ads Pay
