

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

WASHINGTON -- The American Israel Public Affairs Committee will highlight its 14th annual Policy Conference on May 7-8 with a community-wide celebration of Israel's 25th anniversary featuring the first major Washington appearance of the new Israel Ambassador Simcha Dinitz.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Three Moscow scientists have appealed to the American Nobel Prize Laureates in Science to help them in halting the harassment of scientists in the Soviet Union.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Two persons were slightly injured when a home-made bomb exploded April 9 in the business district.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Three Arab terrorists were killed in an explosion April 10 after infiltrating from Syria into the southern Golan Heights.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The Zionist Organization of America, in a six-column advertisement to appear in the New York Times April 13, urged President Nixon to initiate a "crash program" to develop "all possible domestic energy sources to relieve the United States' growing dependence on foreign oil-producing countries because that dependence could expose America's "economic and foreign policy" to the "intolerable" situation of "interference by foreign governments."

NEW YORK -- Israel's newly appointed envoy to Washington, Simcha Dinitz, will make his first major address to the New York community at Philharmonic Hall on Sunday evening, May 6 at the Israel Independence Day Celebration sponsored by the American Zionist Federation.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Senators James Abourezk (D., S.D.) and Mark Hatfield (R. Ore.) urged the United States to back off from its strong support for Israel.

NEW YORK -- Mrs. Golda Meir, Israel's Prime Minister, will address 14 American Jewish communities and answer questions from them by means of a pre-arranged, two-way telephone hookup on Erev Yom Haatzmaut, Sunday, May 6, 1973. The program sponsored by the American Zionist Youth Foundation, will begin at 6 p.m. (New York time) and will last for approximately an hour and a half.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Police have arrested 40 Arabs in the Gaza Strip and an undisclosed number of Arab suspects in Nablus. The mass arrests are believed to be linked to documents seized at terrorist headquarters in Beirut raided by Israeli commandos April 10.
