Recently, I became familiar with the Las Vegas Israelite, of which you edit and publish, and decided to write, asking whether or not you might be willing to place my name and address in it somewhere so as I might possibly reach someone who may be interested in corresponding with me through the mail.

My major reason for asking this of you, Sir, is because I'm presently (and have been for sometime) spending a period of time within the confines of a correctional institution, here in Ohio. I've been incarcerated for approximately six years and I've spent the most part of it, so far, without any correspondence whatsoever. I've made several attempts in placing my name in other papers, but with very little success. Most of the people who have ever replied haven't really been seeking honest friendship. They either just reply out of curiosity or just through playful fun. Mr. Tell, I need someone and I'm not beyond being so proud as not to admit it. I lost my parents in an automobile accident a couple years ago and my previous friends (what I thought to be friends) left me quite sometime before that. Being twenty-six, in prison, and without anyone anywhere is actually kind of hard to handle after a certain period of time. I realize, that your publication isn't a mail correspondence listing, but I'm so hoping you'll make an exception just this once in view of my

LAS VEGAS ISRAELITE situation. I can honestly assure you that I'll be deeply grateful, should you be so kind as to do this for me.

If some type of profile will help toward your decision, I'll offer: I'm 26 years old, I'm from Columbus, Ohio; I'm basically conservative in my way of thinking, my personality is pleasurable to most all people, I enjoy people and being involved in what's going on around the country. As for prison, I've been as stated before, six years, and I've another eighteen months (at least) to spend here before being re-considered for release, or which I'll definitely be given my freedom at that time.

Mr. Tell, I simply can't think of anything else which might help in assisting your decision to go in my favor so I'll close. I will, however, say once again that I'll appreciate all the consideration you may give this. If it's not too large a request, I'd like asking for a reply, letting me know of your decision, so that I might know. Thank you for your time and most importantly -- your consideration.

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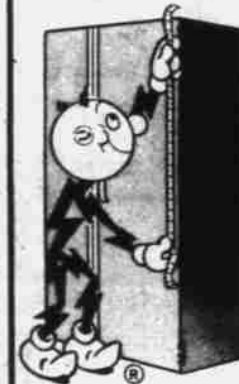

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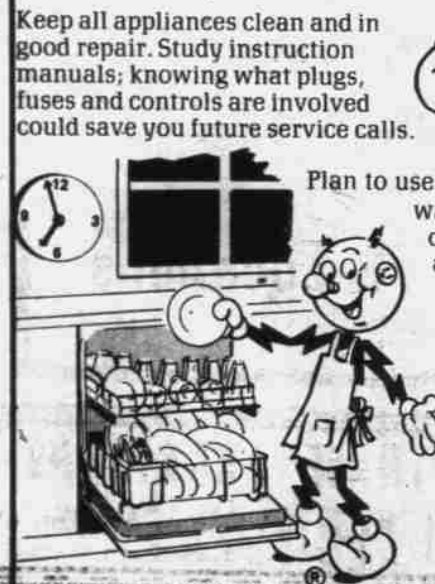


When purchasing electric appliances, buy the size and model that best suits your family's needs. Select appliances that give you the maximum BTU's for every watt used (check with a salesman if the power rating is not readily available)—a more efficient, if slightly more expensive, appliance will save you money in the long run.

Turn radios, televisions, phonographs off when no one is listening or watching.

Check your hot water thermostat—is it unnecessarily high? Try to keep heating and cooling thermostats at one constant setting.

Keep all appliances clean and in good repair. Study instruction manuals; knowing what plugs, fuses and controls are involved could save you future service calls.



Plan to use once-a-day appliances (dishwasher, washer, dryer) after the evening meal or early in the morning. Save once-in-a-while appliances (vacuum cleaner, power tools) for weekends.

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
