WASHINGTON -- Dr. S. Norman Feingold, director of B'nai B'rith Career and Counseling Services, has been named president-elect of the American Personnel and Guidance Asso-

PHILADELPHIA -- "The 30th Anniversary of the Warsaw Ghetto Uprising observed this month must be more than a memorial Yiskor service remembering the Six Million Jewish Martyrs of the Holocaust," declared Dr. Abraham I, Katsh, president of Dropsie University, "It must become an integral part of Jewish ob-servances and daily prayers the year around."

LOS ANGELES -- The 25th Annual Meeting of the Pacific Southwest Regional board of the Anti-Defamation League of B nai B'rith, will be held on Sunday, May 6, 1973, 10:00 A.M. - 3:30 P.M. in The Ballroom of the Beverly Wilshire

NEW YORK -- In a world-wide coordinated project which involved Agudath Israel organizations in various parts of the world, 10,000 Matzoh parcels were shipped to Jews in Soviet Rus-sia. These parcels were prepared and shipped from the European offices of Agudath Israel in time for their arrival before Passover.

WASHINGTON, D. C. -- Two directors of B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundations, Rabbi Joseph Polak of Boston University and Rabbi Edward Feld of the University of Illinois, are numbered among the nineteen campus ministers who have been chosen by the Danforth Foundation of St. Louis as recipients of Underwood Fellowships for 1973-74.

LOS ANGELES -- Alpha Omega, international dental fraternity, will be honored for its "singular efforts on behalf of Russian Jews and Jewish dentists unjustly imprisoned by the U.S. S.R." at the 25th Annual Meeting of the Pacific Southwest Regional Board of the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith on Sun, May 6, at the Beverly Wilshire Hotel.

NEW YORK -- Prominent Leningrad Jewish activist Nicolai Yavour -- who had earlier received permission to emigrate to Israel and paid the required education tax -- was sentenced last week to a year's imprisonment on charges of "hooliganism," the American Jewish Congress has learned.

LONDON (WNS) -- The Supreme Court of the Ukrainian USSR was to hear an appeal April 18 against his 10-year prison sentence by Isaac Shkolnik, sentenced by a military tribunal in Vinnetsa April 10 on charges of spying for Israel and anti-Soviet propaganda. The sentence was the harshest meted out to a Jewish activist since the December 1970 Leningrad hijack trial. Shkolnik's defense counsel withdrew from the case after advising his client to not appeal, and Shkolnik has been unable to find another lawyer to represent him.

ROME (WNS) -- Referring to the neo-Fascist riots in Milan April 12 which left one policeman dead and sent shock waves around Italy, Sandro Perini, Italian Chamber of Deputies president said "It was just like the fascist hooliganism of the 1920's." For more than two hours hundreds of neo-Fascist youth faces covered with black handkerchiefs, strutted through the Milan streets shouting slogans against Communists and Jews. They exchanged Hitler-like salutes.

WASHINGTON -- The Jackson-Mills-Vanik amendment to the pending Trade Bill will be a major topic of the 14th annual Policy Conference the American Israel Public Affairs Committee in Washington, D. C. on May 7-8.

NEW YORK -- Three Moscow jews were detained by Soviet police, the first day of Passover, as they were standing near the synagogue on Archipova Street and one of them -- Arkady Sirotkin -- was beaten by police, the American Jewish Congress learned.

NEW YORK -- Samuel Wigder, chairman of the ZOA's National Aliya Committee, said all evidence indicates an annual Russian Jewish aliya of 50,000 or more through the 1970s.
