

POLITICAL HOPEFULS

COBLENTZ FOR COMMISSIONER

"Regardless of who you vote for, I urge every person in Las Vegas to be sure to vote on the referendum concerning the 'smut peddlers'."

That's the statement issued today by Dr. Alexander Coblentz, who is seeking re-election as Las Vegas City Commissioner on May 8.

According to Dr. Coblentz, who has amassed an enviable record during his first four years in office, the voters are the only ones who can outlaw the theatre and dirty book stores, or "smut shop" who have invested Las Vegas. The referendum had to be placed on the ballot due to the recent liberal U. S. Supreme Court Decisions as interpreted by the Clark County District Courts forcing the City to issue licenses when the City Commission refused to do so and in addition the City Commission has been restrained by the Courts from taking any kind of action on the issue. The only action that can be taken is a vote on the referendum.

In addition to his all-out support against this problem, Dr. Coblentz

has been active in achieving improvements in many areas for Las Vegas. Among these activities has been his voting on matters of fiscal and financial problems that has been instrumental in bringing the City of Las Vegas out of the red and into the black during the past four years. He has been casting votes that have added parks as well as improving existing parks. Also, increased police protection.

As important, Coblentz has been a forerunner in helping develop further the tourist industry which he sees as the lifeline of Las Vegas.

MAESTRO MEHTA TO CONDUCT ISRAEL PHILHARMONIC ORCHESTRA

Maestro Zubin Mehta will conduct the Israel Philharmonic Orchestra in two special concerts during festivities to mark the 25th anniversary of Israel's independence. In addition, he will conduct during a special concert in Bethlehem's historic Manger Square facing the Church of the Nativity.

The 25th anniversary concerts, one in Jerusalem and one in Tel Aviv, both in May, will feature IPO Music Advisor Mehta conducting Mahler's Second Symphony ("The Resurrection") with Maureen Forrester and Israeli soprano Stella Richmond as soloists, accompanied by a large chorus and the Orchestra. The program also will feature the world premiere of a new Israeli composition, winner of the first prize in a composers competition announced by the IPO for the occasion. The winning composition will be announced by the jury headed by Mehta, who has been IPO Music Advisor
