

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK -- Fifteen leading Israeli scholars, writers and journalists arrived in order to participate in a new "Scholars in Residence" program sponsored jointly by the American Zionist federation and the American Zionist Youth Foundation.

WASHINGTON -- In separate letters to Soviet Premier Alexei Kosygin and President Richard Nixon, U. S. Rep. Mario Biaggi, D-N.Y., pleaded for assistance in obtaining the right to emigrate for Jan Krysky who is being held in a Soviet mental institution on charges of "militant Zionism".

NEW YORK -- Ten more Soviet Jewish families have received exit visas without paying the diploma tax but two Jewish activists in Tbilisi have been arrested, the American Jewish Congress learned.

NEW YORK -- A 79-page Directory of Jewish Summer Camps has been published by the National Jewish Welfare Board. For information, copies of the directory are available at \$2.00 each from Publications Services, National Jewish Welfare Board, 15 East 26th Street, New York, N.Y. 10010.

NEW YORK -- There is a new, dynamic organization on the American-Jewish scene--HIN-ENI, to serve American Jewish college students who have become increasingly alienated from Jewish life and values.

WASHINGTON -- The B'nai B'rith Philatelic Service offers three first day covers of six Israeli stamps reproduced from Marc Chagall's stained-glass windows of the 12 tribes of Israel. NEW YORK (LNS) -- Six senior Rabbinical students leave New York this week for two years of study at the Rabbinical College of Australia and New Zealand, which is located in Melbourne. The students are being sent by the Lubavitcher Rabbe, Rabbi Menachem M. Schneerson, the world leader of the Lubavitcher movement, who resides in New York.

NEW YORK -- A special display of blooming desert plants to celebrate Israel's 25th anniversary has been installed in the first planting bed at Rockefeller Center's Channel Gardens at Fifth Avenue, between 49th and 50th Streets. Thousands of roses, carnations, gladiolas and other cut flowers flown in from Israel will be displayed in colorful flower carts at the head of the Channel Gardens as an adjunct to the salute to Israel planting.

NEW YORK -- Seventy Israelis who have completed their military service are currently enrolled in a special college preparatory course for non-high school graduates at Bar-Ilan University. It was reported by Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein, Bar-Ilan Chancellor.

NEW YORK -- Philip E. Hoffman, President of the American Jewish Committee, urged world Jewry to undertake a massive effort to make the facts of Jewish resistance to the Nazi extermination program familiar, especially to Jewish young people.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israel will soon launch a new \$15-ton, \$10 million missile boat which it claims is far superior to 12 similar craft built for it in France several years ago and faster than any Russian-built vessel of the type known to be in Mideastern waters.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Rep. Benjamin Rosenthal (D. N.Y.), chairman of the House Subcommittee on Europe, said there is "little chance" the Soviet Union will repeal its exit tax on prospective emigrants, and that the active "harassment of vocal Jewish dissidents has increased since our elections in Nov."

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Rabbi Emanuel Rackman, chairman of the board of governors of the Religious Zionists of America, called on the American Orthodox Jewish Community to close ranks in support of Israel's Chief Rabbinate as the religious authority of Judaism in Israel.

INDEPENDENT DAY SCHOOL AT TEMPLE WILL OPEN SEPTEMBER

A public meeting of a new independent day school will be held at Temple Beth Shalom on May 16.

The Albert Einstein Day School of Nevada was formally organized April 19.

It was decided that the Albert Einstein Day School, the first independent day school in Las Vegas under the auspices of the Jewish community, will open its doors in September of 1973. At this organizational meeting, the Board of Directors formulated its educational philosophy and established guidelines for the school's curriculum and the hiring of personnel from the Las Vegas educational community.

Founded by a group of public-minded citizens, lay and professional, and in close cooperation with the educational leaders of Temple Beth Shalom, The Albert Einstein Day School will prepare its students to lead meaningful lives as productive American citizens, totally committed to their Jewish heritage. The Albert Einstein Day School will offer a curriculum of outstanding General Studies in combination with a positive learning experience in Jewish Studies.

Initially, The Albert Einstein Day School will offer courses of study from Kindergarten thru the third grade, but the School plans to add additional grades each year.

These programs will provide a total educational experience which is designed to foster the child's academic, social, emotional, and religious growth. The superior secular curriculum will include the basic language, arts, modern mathematics, social and natural sciences, and the fine arts. The Hebrew curriculum will include the study of the Bible, Jewish his-

tory, Law and customs, and the Hebrew language. The program aims to make the student aware of the spiritual relevancy and meaningful importance of his Jewish heritage to his daily life as an American Jew and as a human being in a modern technological world.

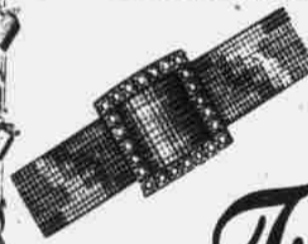
