In a related development New York Mayor John V. The announcement of the trip said Lindsay would "take up the issue of Soviet Jewry with Soviet officials and private citizens, including mem-bers of the Jewish community."

In a separate statement, issued jointly by Maass, Stein and Fisher, the three leaders wel-comed the suspension of the education tax and acknowledged "with appreciation the initiative of President Nixon in this achievement."


