WASHINGTON (WNS) -- The agreement of Sen. Russel Long (D. La.) to co-sponsor the Jackson Amondment to the U.S.-Soviet Trade pact brought to 77 the number of Senators opposed to most favored nation treatment for the Soviet Union while it restricts its citizens' rights to emigrate.
