> TEL AVIV (WNS) -Premier Golda Meir warned Egypt that if it renewed hostilities against Israel it could expect dire consequences. It was her second public warning to Egypt in little more than a week.

The note was never filed until Hughes' auditors went over the books three years later after Bob Maheu was dismissed.

Another item was an advance of half a million in cash for future advertising, for years ignored by Greenspun until, again, auditors found it in the Hughes' books.

Then there is the multi-million dollar golf course deal, which Hughes is contesting in court. So, what is Greenspun attempting to imply by

the damaging memos he says he has? Is Greenspun contending Hughes owes him money?

The most powerful political boss in Nevada, with tentacles clawing every facet of the offices that rule our destinies, is Sun publisher Hank Greenspun.

In return for his endorsement Greenspun demands the high price of strict subservience to his dictates. In the guise of being a public benefactor, he will use threats and pressure to gain his own selfish ends, and woe betied anyone who dares defy his will.

Commissioner Hank Thornley refused to be intimidated by Greenspun, and therefore is the target of the publisher's venom in the upcoming City elections on June 5.

If we are ever to break Greenspun's stranglehold, let us start by careful consideration of the circumstances surrounding the City commissioner's race and determine the greed, the inordinate desire for power and wealth, and the ruthlessness of the man who is backing Thornley's opponent, Paul Christensen.

Christensen is a first-time public office seeker, with no record, good or bad, in his background. During his campaign in the pri-maries he advanced not one single issue. We do not flaw his reputation. But politics make strange bedfellows. Christensen's night-gown companion (literally speaking) is Hank Greenspun, who front-paged a devastating editorial against Thornley on the Sunday before Tuesday's primary election. Here's why.

A supermarket chain was seeking renewal of a slot machine license. Greenspun had a twofold purpose in supporting the renewal. First, there is a \$50,000-a-year existing commitment for advertising, and second, there was talk of the chain opening a branch in a proposed shopping enter owned by Greenspun.

Thornley was one of three commissioners of the five-man commission who had voted against the renewal of the license. Greenspun was adamant with threats and pressure to get Thornley's vote. At one stage an apparent friend warned that Thornley would be accused, by a story in the Sun, of asking for \$25,000 in return for his consent. The story would appear, it was threatened, if Thornley did not vote in the affirmative for the license. The ISRAELITE exposed the plot to assassinate Thornley's character, and nothing ever happened.
