**LURIE FOR COMMISSIONER**

Ron Lurie, Candidate for City Commission #2, is now ending his intensive 10-week campaign on a high note, having nearly completed a door-to-door personal campaign to bring the issues to the voters of Las Vegas.

"During this entire campaign, I have stressed the importance of bringing the issues directly to the people," Lurie said. "I believe the people are interested only in the issues and how I will conduct myself on the Las Vegas City Commission."

Lurie, who shunned attempts by his opponent to become involved in a personal smear campaign, took a stand on the major issues facing the Las Vegas voters. These included: no compromise with pornography, no conflict of interests, reorganization of the planning commission along geographic lines, combining the city General Plan into one comprehensive volume and drastically cutting back spot zoning, a comprehensive crime prevention program, a neighborhood park program to supplement regional parks, open communications between City Hall and the public, and increasing the police narcotics division because dangerous drugs lead to 55% of violent crimes. In addition, Lurie has also pressed for the need to encourage pollution free industry into Las Vegas to supplement City income, elimination of foolish expenditures in the City budget and other issues.

On conflict of interests, Lurie has repeatedly stressed that during his term in office, he would not be a party to the buying or selling of property, nor would he seek a privileged gaming or liquor license. He has stated that because 40% of the City's business involves land use, zoning, variances and planning, to do otherwise would lead to an unavoidable conflict of interest.

"Las Vegas is on the threshold of a tremendous growth period," Lurie said. "Only through honesty in government and full-time dedication to the people without conflict of interests can our City government guide that growth to benefit all the people of Las Vegas and not just a special few."

"These are the goals I will work towards if elected to the Las Vegas City Commission, and I sincerely ask your support," Lurie concluded.
