The 1973-74 Hebrew School Season at Temple Beth Sholom will commence on Wed. Sept. 5 and Sunday School on Sept. 9.

A mini-series of four special summer film presentations by the Cinema X Film Society, funded by the Nevada Humanities Committee, will focus on different aspects of crime, June 1, 15, 22 and 29 at 7:30 p.m. in the Humanities Auditorium (Room 109).

Nevada Power Company has applied to the Nevada Public Service Commission for approval to increase rates in its Las Vegas Division by 2.5 mills per kilowatt - hour, which will increase revenues by approximately 17%. There will be no increase to the first block of the residential and small commercial rates, or application to minimum bills in any

rate class. The added cost to the residential customer is estimated to amount to 13¢ per day on an average.

Congressman David Towell has introduced a bill to create a Legal Services Corporation -- a non-profit organization which would provide legal assistance to the poor.

The Jewish War Veterans Sixth Region Convention will be held in El Paso, Texas, June 9 and 10. Twelve posts will have delegates and Mike Silverman will represent Post 342 from Colorado Springs.

Senators Alan Bible and Howard Cannon have co-sponsored a bill authorizing the Federal government to control salt pollution in the Colorado River, including the Las Vegas Wash.

Fred Dallimore, following four seasons as an assistant, has been named the new head baseball coach for the University of Nevada, Las Vegas.
