NEW YORK -- Rabbi Ludwig Nadelmann has been elected to the new post of Executive Vice President of the Jewish Reconstructionist Foundation. It was announced by Rabbi Ira Eisenstein, President of the organization.

WASHINGTON -- Jack J. Spitzer, Seattle, Washington, civic leader and savings and loan association executive, has been named International Chairman of the Golden Anniversary Committee of Aleph Zadik Aleph, it was announced today by Mrs. Louis L. Perlman, Chicago, chairman of the B'nai B'rith Youth Commission.

NEW YORK -- First Israel Bank changed its name to Bank Leumi Trust Company of New York.

LOS ANGELES -- A senior Fulbright-Hays fellowship to lecture at the laboratory of theoretical chemistry at the University of Paris-South will take Dr. Gerald A. Segal of Los Angeles, associate professor of chemistry at the University of Southern California, to France in the fall.

NEW YORK -- Civic and political leaders joined the New York Jewish community in a city-wide rally in behalf of the beleaguered Jews of Syria and Iraq.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The jury trial of Jewish Defense League members charged with fire-bombing impressario Sol Hurok's office last year opened May 30.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Security services disclosed that they have uncovered a terrorist underground made up of students in the West Bank town of Tulkarem.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- President Ephraim Katzir has called upon Israelis to make every effort at closing the social gap which he said was "especially alarming in Jerusalem". His statement came after he toured the city and returned shocked at the living conditions of some Jewish families.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The Joint Distribution Committee will provide \$2,950,000 during 1973 toward the overseas vocational training program of ORT, Samuel L. Haber, JDC Executive Vice Chairman announced.

NEW YORK -- Pinhas Sapir, Israel's Minister of Finance, will meet with Cabinet Members of the United Jewish Appeal on June 28th to discuss the impact of the increased immigration of Jews from the Soviet Union to Israel.

NEW YORK -- Isaiah L. Kenen of Washington, executive vice president of the American Israel Public Affairs committee since 1954, was elected chairman.

NEW YORK -- Rabbi Wolfe Kelman, the Honorable Yitzhak Rabin, and Julius Silver will receive honorary degrees from the Jewish Theological Seminary of America at the 79th annual commencement on June 10.

ARMS SALE TO ARABS

JERUSALEM (WNS) Concern mounted in official circles here over reports that the U. S. was selling \$500 million worth of modern weaponry and equipment each to Kuwait and Saudi Arabia.

Government circles and the public were especially alarmed by a report Thursday that Washington will sell four Phantom jets to Saudi Arabia.

Deputy Premier Yigal Allon said if true the report only confirms Israel's need for defensible borders on its Eastern frontier. Yitzhak Rabin, Israel's former Ambassador in Washington, said his countrymen must exercise utmost vigilance since the report should remind them that the U. S., while committed to a strong Israel, has other interests in the Middle East.

Israel's Ambassador

to the U. S., Simcha Dinitz, who has already met once with Assistant Secretary of State Joseph J. Sisco on the matter has been asked to seek full details on the quantity and quality of American arms going to the Arab states.

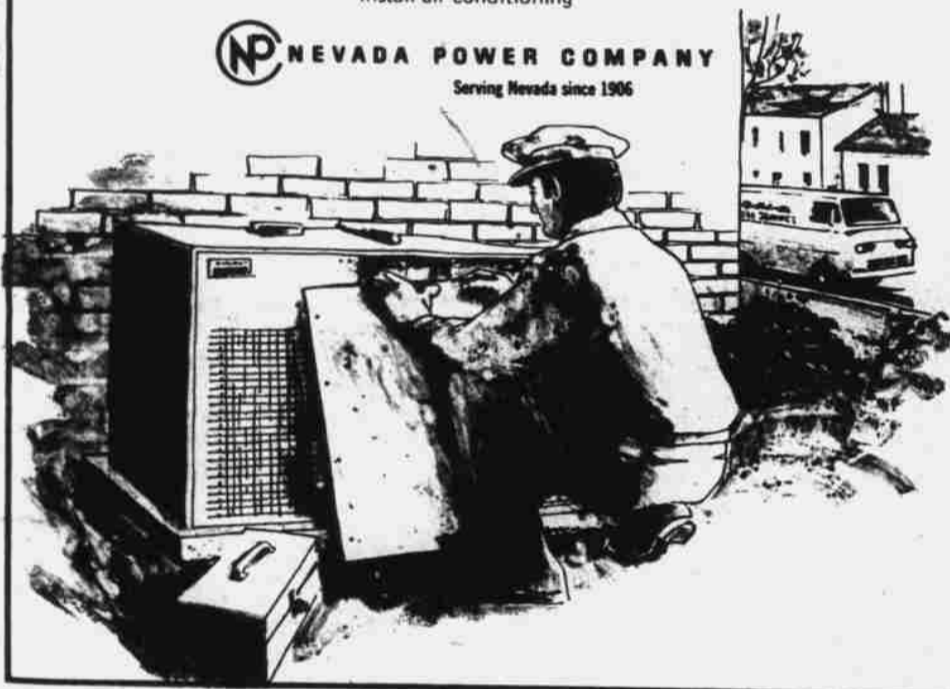
