JERUSALEM (WNS) -- West German Chancellor Willy Brandt arrived in Israel for a four-day visit and immediately went to Jerusalem for a private meeting with Premier Golda Meir in her office which lasted over 90 minutes. Brandt, who arrived aboard a German military transport, was the first off the plane and was greeted by Mrs. Meir, Foreign Minister Abba Eban and Transport Minister Shimon Peres.

Mrs. Meir welcomed Brandt, the first Chancellor of West Germany to visit Israel while in office, as one who is welcomed here "with the esteem due one who, in the darkest period for the human race and especially for the Jewish people, joined forces with those who fought the Nazis." She said that his visit will help further relations between the two countries. Noting that Brandt was here thirteen years ago, Mrs. Meir said that Brandt could now see Israel's accomplishments and could become familiar with its problems, way of life, trials, aspirations and "above all - our aspiration for peace with our neighbors."

Brandt replied that he was invited here as a representative of the new Germany and "this means that you are placing the forces of the past against the expectations of the present." However, he noted that the past could not be erased or ignored and "Cooperation between our countries is characterized by the shadows of our experience." He said the special character of the relationship that has existed between the two countries for the past eight years will be revealed during his talks with Mrs. Meir.

Mrs. Meir and Brandt are expected to discuss the whole gamut of German-Israeli relations as well as the Middle East situation, the European Common Market and Germany's position in the United Nations to which Bonn will be admitted next fall.

URGE MORE NAZI TRIALS

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Simon Wiesenthal, the Nazi hunter, pleaded here for the continuation of trials against those Nazi criminals who have so far escaped punishment in order to educate mankind. He said that the Nazi mass murderers can never be adequately punished, but that the trials are more important whatever the verdict, even when the defendant is acquitted, in order to shatter the indifference of the world.

His remarks were made at the Convocation Dinner of the New York school of the Hebrew Union College - Jewish Institute.

Who's Kidding Who?

Sun publisher Hank Greenspun is one helluva salesman.

You don't think so?

Well, let's see you sell someone a half-million dollars worth of advertising, get the \$500,000 in cash in advance and then forget about it for more than four years. For him it wasn't a mere commission on the sale. He kept the whole pot. What a haul!

Now he's selling newspapers and the job he's doing tops anything in our recollection, even the scare headlines of the old New York Graphic back in the early 1930's. Greenspun milks a story with more finesse than burlesque comedians with one of those old broken down jokes, like: "How long does it take you to get up in the morning?" Answer: "Oh, about 10 minutes." Return: "It takes me 15 minutes. I wash." Rebuttal: "I send mine out."

Greenspun finds more twists to a story than a pretzel maker. In so doing, he keeps the readers gaping and wondering what the next day will unfold. The suckers who shell out the dime for each paper are divided in their hopes and expectations. Half hope to see him get caught in his own machinations. The other half expect him to bring Howard Hughes to his knees, begging to be let off easy.

The wise acres know that neither of these will happen. Greenspun will ease himself out of trouble with the dexterity of a snake in a rock-pile.

Here's his latest caper.

Testimony in the Watergate hearing disclosed that there was talk of breaking into Greenspun's safe for papers that would prove embarrassing to Muskie, during the last presidential primary campaign. It was stated a Howard Hughes plane would be standing by to take the alleged, would be thieves, to a South American country.

Any other publisher would print his own version of the circumstances as an exclusive in his own paper. Not Greenspun.

He called a press conference, mostly for radio and TV newscasters. Hank's story was that it was not the Muskie paper the thieves were after. It was inconsequential. What the robbers really wanted, said Hank, with a serious face, were confidential, signed papers of Howard Hughes. Then he went on telling how the Hughes' papers in his safe spoke of manipulating national and state politics and dealt with income tax violations. Those were the
