

Assistant Secretary of terms, Rabin said, and State Joseph J. But Sisco said there was no way the State Department could guar-antee that the Saudis would not transfer the jets to a third country to be used against Is-rael. He said he was confident that this would not happen because of friendship between the US and Saudi Arabia, the provision in the agreement that bars such transfer without US approval and the deepening of the relations between the two countries.

However in Tel Aviv Israel's. former Ambassador to the United States, Gen. Yitzhak Rabin, said that the US was well aware that American arms sent to Arab countries would be used against Israel in case of war. He said the best proof was the tanks sent to Jordan under the US-Jordanian arms deal of 1966 which were used against Israel in the 1967 war. U.S. tanks crossed the Jor-
