

10 ISRAELI POWs FOR 56 EGYPTIAN

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Three Israeli fighter pilots, who had been held captive by Syria for 3 years, had a joyous homecoming with relatives amidst speculation that Egypt may now agree to release its 10 Israeli PWs in exchange for 56 Egyptian PWs now held in Israel. Arab affairs experts here believe that Syria

agreed to return the 3 Israelis in exchange for 46 Syrian and 10 Lebanese PWs as a preparatory move for the Security Council debate on the Middle East. One commentator said it appeared fairly certain that the Egyptians were coordinating with Syria on the PW issue.

However, Defense Minister Moshe Dayan,

while witnessing the exchange on the Golan Heights, said that it might pave the way for a similar exchange with Egypt but he didn't want to raise too much hope for that prospect.

The freed Israelis, Captain Gideon Magen and Pinhas Nahmani and Lt. Boaz Eitan, said they were subjected to torture while captives of

the Syrians. Lt. Eitan lost several fingers and toe nails and said he permanently lost the hearing of one ear as a result of repeated beatings on the head by his captors. Capt. Magen suffered multiple fractures.

After the Israeli charges of torture were publicized, the Syrian Defense Ministry charged that its returned PWs claimed that they

had been subjected to physical and psychological torture by the Israelis and that they were denied medical treatment.

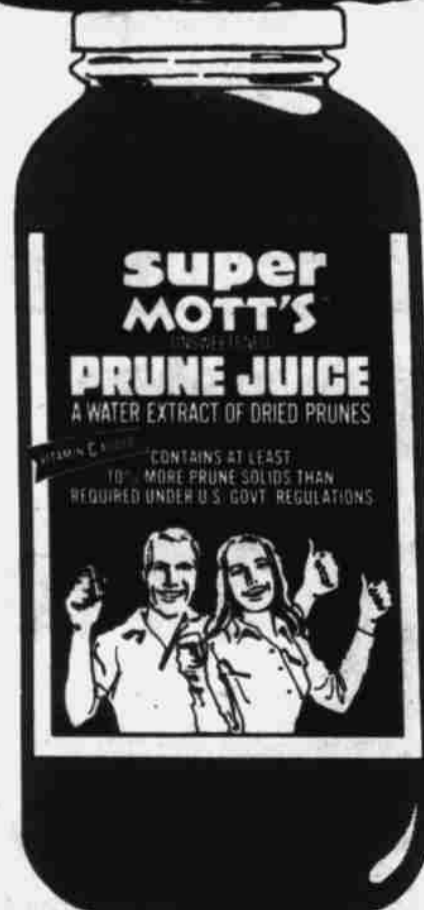
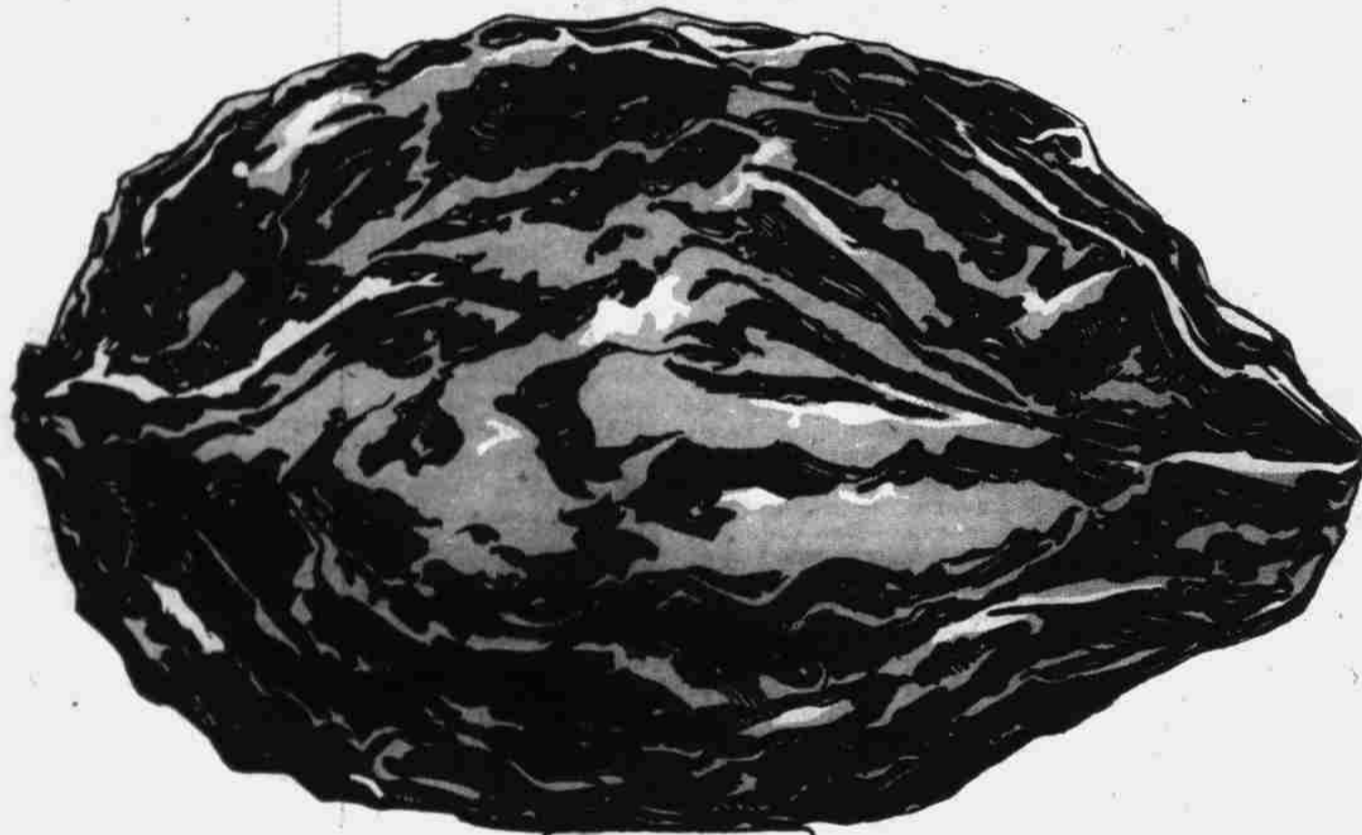
This was flatly denied by Gen. David Elazar, Israel's Chief of Staff, who said Damascus was trying to divert attention from the horrible way the Syrians treated the Israeli prisoners. Elazar said he witnessed the exchange and

specifically asked the Syrians how they were treated and was told, "we were treated quite well."
