NEW YORK -- Following extensive renovations, the JDC/Malben Home for the Aged in Jerusalem will henceforth be available to all of Jerusalem's elderly citizens, instead of being limited to new immigrants, it was announced by Edward Ginsberg, Chairman of the Joint Distribution Committee.

ATLANTA, GEORGIA -- Leaders of the Central Conference of American Rabbis sharply condemned the Nixon Administration's continued failure to provide adequate funds for badly needed social programs aiding the poor, the young, the sick and racial minorities, particularly since we have disengaged ourselves from the Vietnam War.

LOS ANGELES -- Harry Keaton, Los Angeles lawyer and well-known communal leader, was elected chairman of the Executive Committee of the Anti-Defamation League's Pacific Southwest Regional Board, it was announced by Judge Robert Feinerman, president of the Board.

PHILADELPHIA, PA. -- Recognition of the educational activities and its efforts to introduce the study of Israel and its culture in Jewish Education in the United States was given to the Department of Education and Culture of the World Zionist Organization at the 47th Annual Conference of the National Council for Jewish Education.

NEW YORK -- New direction and professional guidance for the adult and religious school programs of Reform Judaism's 710 - member congregations has been assured with the appointment of Abraham Segal, N.Y.C., as the new Director of Education of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations.

WASHINGTON -- U.S. Rep. Mario Biaggi was "strongly opposed" to the Nixon Administration plan to sell F-4 Phantom fighter jets to Saudi Arabia, in a statement before the House of Representatives.

NEW YORK -- The appointment of Jack Boeko, executive director of the New Orleans, La., Jewish Community Center, as a community consultant for the National Jewish Welfare Board was announced by Herbert Millman, executive vice-president of JWB.

US SUPPORTS ISRAEL IN UN

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- The Security Council debated the Middle East crisis with the Arab states and their supporters, demanding that Israel withdraw from occupied areas before negotiations could begin and Israel maintaining that negotiations must come first.

The U. S. reiterated its support of Resolution 242 as the basis for a settlement. U.S. Ambassador John Scali called the present situation in the Middle East "neither natural nor permanent," but said peace could not be reached without "an ongoing dialogue" between the two sides. Scali maintained that outside

parties could not make the peace, only set the right climate.

Israeli Ambassador Yosef Tekoah repeatedly urged the Council not to tamper with Resolution 242 which he called "the only existing basis for agreement on a just and lasting peace." He said Israel would not withdraw before negotiations and a subsequent agreement are reached.

The Soviet Ambassador Yacov Malik said the

prerequisite for peace was Israeli withdrawal from all Arab territories captured in the Six-Day War. He said the crisis in the Middle East was a threat to the entire world and existed solely because of Israel's "aggressive arrogant manner."

But the British Ambassador, Kenneth D. Jamieson said his government supports Resolution 242 without changes and also supports resumption of the Jarring mission.
