RECONSIDER PHANTOM JET SALE

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Thirty-two Congressmen have asked President Nixon to reconsider the proposed sale of Phantom jets to Saudia Arabia because they fear the planes will be transferred to Egypt. The Congressmen noted that Egypt reportedly received Mirage jets from Libya despite a stipulation in the Franco-Libyan purchase agreement that they were not to be transferred to a third power.

Meanwhile in Jerusalem, Foreign Mini-

ster Abba Eban urged Knesset members "not to lose balance" over the issue. But he warned that providing Phantoms to a state whose leaders call for a holy war against Israel might encourage war and postpone peace.

Dov Milman of Gahak opposition said U. S. supplies to Saudi Arabia might encourage Egypt.

Syria and Jordan to undertake military action against Israel.

NO MIDEAST POLICY CHANGE

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Israel does not expect any significant change in the Middle East policy of either the United States or the Soviet Union to emerge from the Nixon -

Brezhnev summit talks, according to a senior government official here.

He said the U. S. had made it clear it intends to stand firm on its Middle East position.

In Washington, President Nixon and Soviet Communist Party Secretary Leonid I. Brezhnev are believed to have discussed the Middle East briefly and then decided to have their subordinates go into the subject at greater detail.

ISRAEL RESISTS PAY FREEZE

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The selective pay freeze decided by the Cabinet is being criticized by economists who claim it will not curb inflation.

Moshe Zanbar, Governor of the Bank of Israel, said the freeze would succeed only if it were of short duration and the time was used to work our fundamental measures to fight inflation.

Meanwhile the Histadrut and the Manufacturers Association continued to argue over the size of the cost-of-living allowance to be given workers to compensate for rising prices. The Histadrut insists that compensation for

the last price increase must be paid in full. But the manufacturers are willing to pay an additional COL allowance, but not the full amount.

At the same time strikes and slowdowns continue to plague the country.

TRIAL OF JEWS CANCELLED

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Soviet authorities have apparently decided to call off a planned show trial that reportedly would have involved 100 Jews in Minsk accused of establishing a "Zionist underground" there, according to Jewish sources in the USSR.
