

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The World Conference of Jewish Organizations will meet in Geneva July 15 and 16 with some 75 delegates coming from North and South America, Europe, South Africa, Australia and Israel.

MONTREAL (WNS) -- Israel Ambassador to Canada Theodor Meron told delegates to the fending convention of the Sephardic Federation of Canada that Israel is making progress in reducing the social and educational gap.

VIENNA (WNS) -- The strike by 6,000 salaried physicians employed by government and sick fund hospitals and clinics ended here after 29 days.

VIENNA (WNS) -- Austrian Chancellor Bruno Kreisky and visiting Soviet Premier Alexei N. Kosygin agreed that the Middle East should be on the agenda of the European Security Conference in Helsinki, Finland.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- The strike by 6,000 salaried physicians employed by government and sick fund hospitals and clinics ended here after 29 days.

LONDON (WNS) -- Princess Margaret will visit Egypt next fall at the request of the Foreign Office as a political emissary although she will not directly discuss politics.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The recently formed American Sephardi Federation has joined the American Zionist Federation as a full member, the first national non-Zionist group to be permitted to do so.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Some 1,500 Jewish athletes from throughout the world are in Israel for the ninth Maccabiah Games.

NEW YORK -- In a sharply worded letter to the president of the Mobil Oil Corporation, the Zionist Organization of America charged that a Mobil advertisement in The New York Times counsels the U.S. to pursue "a policy of appeasement and superficial expediency" toward Arab nations in the Middle East.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The overwhelming victory of City Controller Abraham D. Beame over Rep. Herman Badillo in the run-off primary for the Democratic mayoral nomination may give New York City its first Jewish mayor.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Defense Minister Moshe Dayan married Mrs. Rachel Korem in a simple ceremony performed. It was the second for both.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Dr. Nahum Goldmann, president of the World Jewish Congress, has warned that Jews, especially in the U.S., having become prosperous and influential, are in danger of forgetting their timeless Jewish ideals and renouncing Jewry's universal mission.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Police Minister Shlomo Hillel has called Jerusalem a testing ground for Arab-Jewish relations which will determine Israel's "ability to live with Arabs across the border."

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The National Broadcasting Company has agreed to hire an Orthodox Jew as a studio technician after the National Jewish Commission on Law and Public Affairs said it would take legal action. The Jew complained that he had been refused a job because he said he could not work on Friday nights and Saturdays on a rotating basis with other employees.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- A special committee on Israel's social problems has reported to the Cabinet that social distress in the country is concentrated exclusively among families of Asian and African origin.

LOS ANGELES (WNS) -- The Histadrut Foundation has raised over \$29 million in the United States in longterm commitments for labor, economic, health, education and welfare programs in Israel.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Anatoly Leibgrober, a 24-year-old mathematician from Moscow, who had joined six older Jewish scientists in a hunger strike, arrived in Israel.

ISRAEL CLAIMS NO POW DEAL WITH EGYPT

JERUSALEM (WNS)

-- A Foreign Ministry spokesman has denied a report by the Baltimore Sun that a prisoner-of-war exchange with Egypt was aborted last month because Israeli POWs returned from Syria revealed they had been tortured.

The Sun said the exchange was to have taken place June 8 for ten Israeli POWs in Egypt and the 58 Egyptian prisoners in Israel.

Israel says there were no exchange agreements with Cairo.

The spokesman refused to discuss the Sun's report that Defense Minister Moshe Dayan overruled instructions to the returned POWs from Foreign Minister Abba Eban not to say anything about torture. But unofficial sources said the Foreign Ministry wanted Israel to follow the U.S. example in Vietnam of not saying anything about torture until all prisoners were returned.

Soviet Union to let Jews who want to emigrate to Israel to do so. The resolution also contained an expression of WJC president Dr. Nahum Goldmann's controversial view that support should be provided for the rights of Jews who wish to remain in Russia.

Meanwhile in Helsinki, British Foreign Secretary Sir Alec Douglas-Home told Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko of widespread British concern about the treatment of Soviet Jews but did not receive any positive reply.

The number of Soviet Jewish emigrants has dropped slightly compared with last year, according to diplomatic reports from Moscow. So far this year 15,000 Soviet Jews emigrated as compared to 15,800 last year. In Vienna, Soviet Premier Alexei N. Kosygin said he has little sympathy for Russian Jews who emigrated to Israel and now want to return to the Soviet Union. Sixty such Jews petitioned him for his help.
