

A broad array of speakers representing its multi-faceted in-terests, will address Hadassah's 59th annual national convention at the Denver Hilton Hotel August 26-29. Speakers include: Israel ambassador to US, Simcha Dinitz; Senator Peter Dominick (R. Col.); Fred W. Friendly, Ford Foundation advisor on TV and Public Broad-casting; Dr. Carl A. Hadassah, the largest women's organization in the world, maintains a network of medical, educational and rehabilitative services in Israel and sponsors youth, education and community volunteer programs in the US. WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Senators Henry M. Jackson (D. Wash.) and J. William Fulbright (D. Ark.) exchanged bitter attacks on each other over Jackson's amendment to withhold mostto their former homes favored nation trade status from the Soviet Union unless it permitted free emigration of Jews and others. Ful-bright, chairman of the Senate Foreign Rela-tions Committee, said the Jackson Amendment aimed at a renewal of the cold war and that for the Soviet Union and with each other is "too important to be compromised by meddling -even idealistic meddling -- in each others affairs." Fulbright's remarks were made at a speech to the American Bankers Association.

Jackson, replying to him on television, said that Fulbright, along with Soviet Communist Party Secretary Leonid I. Brezhnev, was the le-ading advocate "of one way deals with Russia, we give and they take." He said he wanted genuine cooperation which was based on the easing of tensions and the free movement of people and ideas across borders.
