## UN Ignores Terrorism

The United Nation's 35-member committee on international terrorism seems to be in no hurry to find a way to combat terrorism. Although it is supposed to come up with concrete recommendations by the time the General Assembly convenes in September, the committee met on each of the first two sessions for only 15 minutes and on the third day was in session for a half hour and then adjourned without setting a date for the next meeting.

International terrorism is one of the most immediate dangers confronting the world today. Countless innocent people throughout the globe are in jeopardy daily because someone feels his cause gives him the right to kill, kidnap, hijack or bomb. From July 16-20 alone, 17 persons were held hostage for four hours by an Arab terrorist, five persons were injured when a bomb exploded in a Jerusalem marketplace and grenades were found in two Haifa movie houses and a Tiberias beach. Let's not forget the murder of Israeli Air Attache Yosef Alon outside his suburban Washington And perhaps the committee needs a reminder that it was created in the wake of the massacre of Il Israeli athletes at the Olympic Games in Munich.

Maybe the committee, which includes five Arab states but not Israel, is only confirming expectations that it would not do anything concrete. The General Assembly established the body last December over the objections of the United States and other countries who claimed it was a delaying tactic. The Arab states, joined by the Soviet and African blocs, had defeated a proposal for a convention on the prevention and punishment of terrorism.

Israel justly wants such an international agreement that would prevent nations from sheltering or assisting terrorists while requiring them to extradite the terrorists or put them on trial. The United States and other nations have correctly pointed out that the committee could study the causes of terrorism as it was asked to do by the Assembly, but that this is no reason to prevent acting on ending inter-national criminal violence now.

The terrorists may be watching the international community to see how far they will be allowed to go in carrying on their bloody deeds. Is it too much to suggest that the lackadaisical manner of the committee encouraged the latest acts of terrorism?
