CALIFORNIA STANDARD OIL COMPANY URGES ARAB ASPIRATION SUPPORT

LATE NEWS ON ATHENS MURDERS

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- The leniency shown by some countries to Arab terrorists led to the attack in the Athens airport in which three persons were killed and 55 injured, according to Shimon Peres, Israel Communications Minister. He said every country must make an energetic effort to "behead this dangerous snake of terrorism."

In Athens, the two Arabs who threw hand grenades and opened fire with pistols in the crowded airport transit lounge have refused to answer questions, according to authorities. Earlier it was reported that they claimed to be members of the Black September terrorist group and said that "we have done what we came for -- our mission is accomplished."

Police are also questioning two Arab speaking young women who were taken from the airport kicking and screaming.

First reports of the incident resulted in placing Lod Airport under a state of emergency. It was feared that the Athens attack might have been a diversion for another attack elsewhere or that the Arabs were planning to hijack a plane bound for Tel Aviv.

The emergency at Lod was relaxed after passengers arrived from Athens.

The two Americans killed in the attack were positively identified as Mrs. Jeannie Salandi, 23, of Highland Park, N.J. and Elbert Kersen, 53, a Union, N.J. plumbing contractor. Kersen's wife, Kate, and Mrs. Salandi's husband William were among the wounded. The third person killed was an Austrian.

Palestinian guerrilla organizations in Beirut denied any connection with the attack and blamed it on "enemies of the Palestinian revolution."

MRS. MEIR URGES DAY SCHOOLS

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Premier Golda Meir used two separate forums to express her fears of assimilation of Jews in the Western World.

Speaking to the Religious Zionists of America in Jerusalem, she declared that the assimilation figures in the US were "a nightmare" to her and urged the creation and support of Jewish day schools.

Later, Mrs. Meir told the World Convention of Polish Jewry Federations that she feared large segments of Jewry in the West will disappear through assimilation. She blamed parental indifference to the quality of Jewish life in the home.

LOS ANGELES (WNS) -- Standard Oil of California has asked its 262,000 stockholders and 40,000 employees to support "the aspirations of the Arab people" and "their efforts toward peace in the Middle East."

Standard Oil Chairman Otto N. Miller in a special letter said that the US should support the Arab position because Middle East oil reserves are vital to "the future welfare of the Western world."

This is the first time that a major oil company has taken such a strong and public stand on the Arab side of the Middle East issue. Miller's letter which did not mention Israel by name, recommended that the US "work more closely with the Arab governments to build up and enhance our relations with the Arab people." The letter did not mention that Saudi Arabia and Iran together provided 61% of Standard's world-wide production of crude oil in 1972.

"A crude corporate intervention in American foreign policy", was the way Mr. Jacob Stein, chairman of the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations, described the letter sent by the Standard Oil Company of California to employees and stockholders. Mr. Stein said that "peace in the Middle East is so sensitive and subject to such continued and delicate negotiations that this gross interference by a multi-national corporation will set back the cause of peace in the Middle East."

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Sen. John V. Tunney (D. Ca.) and many Jewish organizations have denounced a letter from Standard Oil of California to its stockholders and employees urging greater US support for the Arab position because of the importance of Middle East oil. Tunney called the letter "counter-productive to peace" in the Middle East and declared that "we cannot solve our fuel crisis by selling out Israel."

Rabbi Israel Miller, president of the American Zionist Federation, expressed the "deep sense of outrage and resentment of the organized Zionist movement in the US."

I. L. Kenen, chairman of the American-Israel Public Affairs Committee, charged the letter "was tantamount to a demand for reversal of US policy which now strives for a negotiated settlement" and accused the company of trying to mobilize a pro-Arab lobby and of being "an open champion of Saudi Arabia."

Zev Yaroslavsky, director of the Southern Council for Soviet Jewry in LA, said members of his organization were planning a "project bonfire" to burn Standard Oil Credit cards.
