

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK -- Authors and literary critics who will make themselves available for lectures to local Jewish communities during Jewish Book Month are listed in a new publication just issued by the National Jewish Welfare Board. It is announced by Dr. Eugene B. Borowitz, president of JWB's Jewish Book Council. Contact JWB, 15 E. 26th St. N.Y.C., N.Y. 10010.

NEW YORK -- Dr. Zalman M. Shapiro, a leading American nuclear scientist, and Dr. Leonid Tarassuk, a high-ranking Russian Jewish scholar who waged an intense struggle to be allowed to emigrate to Israel, will address the 76th National Convention of the Zionist Organization of America Aug. 30-Sept. 2 in Houston. Isaac M. Oberman, chairman of the ZOA Convention Committee, announced.

JERUSALEM -- The president of the American Jewish Congress, Rabbi Arthur Hertzberg, said that American Jews must not "choose sides" in the confrontation between the White House and the Legislature over the issue of Soviet Jews.

JERUSALEM -- The eleventh American-Israel "Dialogue" ended with only partial agreement on its theme -- "The Sources of Jewish Creativity" -- but with broad agreement on the need for Jewish artists and writers in the U. S. and Israel to work together in strengthening ties between American Jewry and the Jewish state.

JERUSALEM -- The American-Israel "Dialogue" opened with a warning from Rabbi Arthur Hertzberg, president of the American Jewish Congress, that Jewish tradition could "evaporate -- even in Israel" in an atmosphere of rejection of the Jewish past by Jewish writers and artists.

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- The 35-member Ad Hoc Committee on International Terrorism has failed to reach any agreement on the definition, cause and ways to deal with the problem.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The Cabinet has defended the interception of a Lebanese Middle East Airlines Caravelle by the Israeli Air Force as part of the struggle Israel has to wage against international terrorism because of the lack of action by other countries. The Cabinet reiterated its stand "to fight terrorists whenever possible before they are able to act."

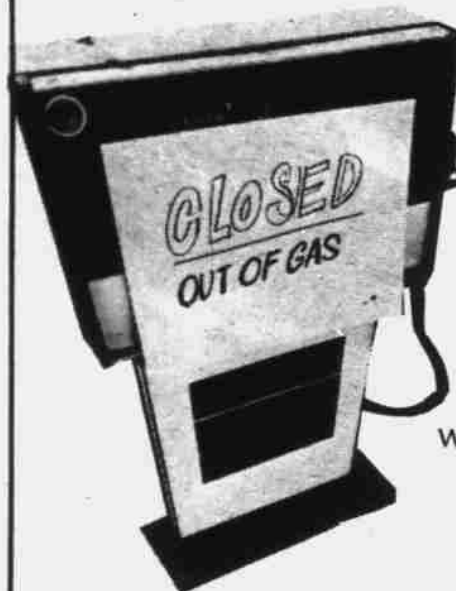
