JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

DENVER, "The first city in the world to undertake full responsibility for every handicapped child born within its boundaries, is Jerusalem, " Faye L. Schenk, national Hadassah Medical Organization chairman reported to 2,500 delegates at Hadassah's 59th annual convention.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Israeli Finance Minister Pinhas Sapir will be honored at a National Dinner of Tribute in Washington Sept. 8 celebrating his 10th anniversary as head of the Ministry of Finance and his 18 years as a member of the Israel Cabinet.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- The story of the Holocaust, depicted in multi-media, will be presented during the coming college semester in 10 cities housing major American Univer-sities, arranged by B'nai B'rith through its Hillel Foundations and adult Jewish education programs and it is partially financed by a \$10,000 grant from the World Federation of Bergen-Belsen Association, survivors of the Nazi death camp.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Premier Golda Meir will address the European Council in Strasbourg at the end of September.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- New York State Supreme Court Judge Anthony Digiovanna has offered to mediate a dispute between the Association of Jewish Anti-Poverty Workers and the State and City of New York in an attempt to reach a compromise over the scheduling of voter registration on the Jewish Sabbath and Jewish holidays.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- During a private dinner meeting at the home of Israeli Ambassador Simcha Dinitz 40 American Jewish community leaders unanimously pledged themselves to greater gifts to the 1974 United Jewish Appeal.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The Government is now requiring that organizations or institutions supported financially by the government or the Jewish Agency must get approval from the Emer-gency High Fund Commission to raise funds independently.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The six World Con-gress for Jewish Studies, attended by 1400 delegates from 24 countries and Israel, ended its meeting here with a call to scientists throughout the world to help secure freedom of movement for scientists and researchers everwhere.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israel has billed the Lebanese Middle East Airways for fuel and other services supplied to the Mea Boeing 707 that was hijacked to Lod Airport.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Foreign Minister Abba Eban said Israel will continue to maintain its diplomatic presence in every possible country in Africa despite recent diplomatic setbacks.

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- Secretary General Kurt Waldheim will start his five-nation tour of the Middle East by first going to Geneva to confer with Gunnar V. Jarring, his special representative on the region.

MONTREAL (WNS) -- The general council of the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) has unanimously adopted a resolution condemning Israel for intercepting a Lebanese sirliner Aug. 10 and forcing it to land at an Israeli airbase.

ATHENS (WNS) -- The two Arab terrorists responsible for the shoot-out at Athens Airport in which three persons were killed and 55 injured have been charged with voluntary homicide, assault and breach of public order,

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The film "Jesus Christ Superstar" opened in New York as two national Jewish organizations -- the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith and the American Jewish Committee -- condemned it as contributing to anti-Semitism.

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- Secretary General Kurt Waldheim, who has been discussing the Middle East with East European leaders, plans to attend a meeting of non-aligned nations in Algeria next month.

NO ISRAELI HOUSING FOR SINGLE IMMIGRANTS

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The number of singles applying for aliya is declining because unmarried immigrants are not getting a fair deal in housing, according to participants at a meeting of more than 200 singles here. They complained that there is no government-sponsored housing with small apartments for the unmarried.

Yitzhak Wolfson, deputy director of the Ministry of Absorption's Jerusalem office said the housing shortage was general and also affected families. He advised the singles to go to development town where housing is available.

But Eliezer Kroll, a senior official of the Jewish Agency's immigration department, said the singles were right to complain and advised them to become more vocal and exercise pressure on the government.

Meanwhile a study by the Central Bureau of Statistics found that 15% of the 7,500 adult immigrants and potential immigrants who arrived in Israel between September and December 1969 left the country by the end of the third year.

Of the remainder, 88% definitely had decided to stay and 9% were not sure. This group is most satisfied with housing, according to the study, and less so with their jobs.

The Absorption Ministry reports a 50% in-crease in the employment of immigrant scientists and academic workers and said this is due to the ministry's special projects fund which pays part of the immigrants' salaries during the first year.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- As reports came in from Moscow of officially organized harrassment of Israeli athletes and Jewish spectators at the World University Games, American Jewish organizations began to seek to bar Moscow as a site for the 1980 Olympic Games.

JERUDALEM (WNS) -- The Cabinet has approved establishment of an "Everyman's University" pilot project to enable adults to earn college degrees, will be financed and administered by the Rothschild Foundation.

MONTREAL (WNS) -- The Canadian Israel Committee has accused the Standard Oil Co. of California of trying to make Israel "the scape-goat for a fictitious 'energy crisis" in order to win





JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The Knesset has been called back from vacation for a special session to discuss the strike by 1,500 seamen which has immobilized Israeli ships.


