

## JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The head of the Labor Zionist Alliance has called for the United States government to nationalize American oil companies as a "response to the so-called energy crisis contrived by the oil companies." Speaking to the national executive committee of the LZA, Dr. Judah J. Shapiro declared that "Israel is not an issue in this non-existent energy crisis, but ethical considerations and socialist principles are."

PARIS (WNS) -- French newspapers criticized the French government over the safe conduct granted five Arab terrorists who occupied the Saudi Arabian Embassy and were permitted to leave France with six hostages bound and under gunpoint.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- The Labor Party Secretariat has over-whelmingly approved proposals by Defense Minister Moshe Dayan that will open the way to private land purchases by Jews in the administered territories, increasing Jewish settlement in the territories and reduce the Arab labor force presently working in Israel.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- United National Secretary General Kurt Waldheim after returning from his five-nation Middle East tour sent a telegram to Foreign Minister Abba Eban stating: "The understanding I found in your country toward my efforts to contribute a just and lasting peace is a source of great encouragement to me."

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Adib Yousouf Halabi, a 23-year-old Druze from a Golan Heights village has been sentenced to 25 years imprisonment for mailing letter-bombs last winter to President Nixon U.S. Secretary of State William P. Rogers and Defense Secretary Melvin Laird.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Sen. Walter Mondale (D. Minn.) plans to propose legislation for joint Israeli-American research and other activities regarding education for disadvantaged children.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- One hundred and forty delegates, including 15 ministers, from 51 nations are attending the Rehovot Conference.

BOSTON (WNS) -- Tufts University has rescheduled the course "Zionism Reconsidered" for the second year despite protests from members of the Boston Jewish community that it is anti-Zionist.

NEW YORK -- The American Jewish Congress urged American athletes to refuse to take part in sports events in the Soviet Union and called on the U.S. Olympic Committee to fight any proposal to hold the 1980 Olympics in Moscow.

NEW YORK, N.Y. -- The actions of Soviet soldiers in tearing up an Israeli flag during the World University Games in Moscow constitutes not only an act of "hooliganism" but demonstrates the unfitness of the USSR for consideration to hold the 1980 Olympic games in their country.

HAIFA - Over 300 students from Israel and 20 countries around the world are participating this year in the annual programme for the exchange of students for technical experience, organized by the Technion - Israel Institute of Technology.

NEW YORK -- Leaders of Jewish Community Centers in the U.S. and Canada will visit Jewish communities in five Latin American countries, from November 11 to 28, as part of a Fact-Finding Study Mission organized by the World Service Committee of the National Jewish Welfare Board.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Two Moscow Jewish activists, Prof. Moisei Gitterman and Victor Mandelaweig, have been notified they can leave the Soviet Union, the Student Struggle for Soviet Jewry reported.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Mahmoud Harum, editor of the Hebrew news program on Jordanian TV, was arrested when he returned to Amman after a two-week visit to the West Bank and Israel.
