NO NEGOTIATIONS WITH TERRORISTS

JERUSALEM (WNS)
-- Foreign Minister Ab-
ba Eban emphasized to
the Knesset that Israel
has no intention of ne-
gotiating with the Pal-
estinians and that it con-
siders Jordan to be the
Palestine state.

He said the problem
of the Palestinians will
be solved through ne-
gotiations between Is-
rael and its Arab nei-
ghbors. Eban added that
Jordan has always had a
Palestinian majority
and noted that Tunisian
President Habib Bour-
guiba recently termed
Jordan an "artificial
entity."

President's Message

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- President Nixon
in his annual greeting to American Jews for
the High Holy Days urged all American "to
remember the essentially democratic theme
of Judaism -- that the most exalted and the
lowest stand equal before God" Nixon ex-
pressed the hope that the High Holy days will
"provide for all of us an opportunity for re-
newed commitment to the sacred principles
upon which our nation is established, and may
the conduct of our national life be a testament
to the strength and vitality of those principles
in our personal life."

STANDARD OIL SENDS SECOND LETTER

LOS ANGELES (WNS)
-- The Jewish Feder-
ation has reported that
Standard Oil of Calif.
has sent a new letter
to its 300,000 employes
and stockholders "clar-
ifying" an earlier let-
ter in which it urged
the U.S. to be more
concerned with Arab as-
pirations in the Middle
East.

The new letter appar-
ently calls for a "pe-
ace" agreement "fair and
equitable to all states"
in the Mideast.

Los Angeles Jews

the company's credit
cards were destroyed
by the holders.

Women for Minyan

After 5734 years, our Jewish religion, at
least the Conservative branch of it, decided
that women may take their places alongside the
traditional role reserved only for men, as
members of a minyan.

No sooner, after the news was released by
the Rabbinical Assembly and appeared on the
front page of the New York Times, objectors
and those who agreed, voiced their views.

Orthodox groups, the world over, criticized
the innovations. But American Jewish Congress
and National Jewish women's groups, naturally
approved.

It is interesting to note that some local wo-
men we informed of the break with tradition,
were not too over-enthusiastic. Be that as it
is, here are the ramifications:
