EVA MARIE SAINT is nothing short of magnificent in TENNESEE WILLIAMS' "Summer and Smoke" at the Huntington Hartford in Hellowed in Hollywood. Miss Saint, a much neglected actress in films, does not have one false moment on stage, a feat that many actors attempt but few succeed. She is perfection and I can only hope that she'll be re-discovered by some creative producer and just maybe be given a role that's worthy of her talent. I guess that's asking too much but what the hell, it could happen. RONNY COX is fine as John and the supporting cast is all good although some a bit overdone, JEFFREY HAYDEN has directed with the right touch, bringing out the comedy of the play without sacrificing the pathos. It is really theatre at its finest.

Another lovely blonde who has been neglected by Hollywood is the fabulous ANN DEE whose extraordinary singing voice is loved by all who hear it but she has yet to make the big Producer JACK DOMINGUEZ decided to do something about it and built a "divine musical revue" around her for two performmusical revue around her for two performances at the Wilshire Ebell. "Yesterday and Today" was lavishly produced with a large orchestra, a lovely set and gorgeous costumes. You see, Ann Dee doesn't merely sing a song, she acts it.
