JERUSALEM: The lights are on again in Israel.

Cancellation of the blackout which has tossed a blackness over the country for the past 18 nights was announced this evening. Oct. 24, a few minutes before 6 p.m.

Slowly but surely, lights came winking through the blackness as people removed the heavy curtains and other protective covering from the windows.

Although eyes become accustomed to the dark overa period of 18 nights, one does not get used to it. The cease-fire, violated by Egypt on Monday, was reinstated this morning at 7 a.m. Nonetheless, Egyptians continued the attack in the area in which the Third Army is situated.

It is understood that these attacks were made in an effort to extricate Egyptian Forces from the position in which they are encircled,

On the Syrian front, it was quiet along the entire line, much more so than along the South, despite the lateness of Syria's agreement to the cease-fire.

Israeli forces have been given strict instructions to enforce the cease-fire. "When we are attacked," an army spokesman stated," we reply. But we do not initiate any action."

Israel's Foreign Minister Abba Eban this evening expressed the hope that in spite of the Egyptian violations, the cease-fire would be honored. He looked forward to an early beginning in cease-fire negotiations which will include an exchange of prisoners, determin-ation of boundaries and a secure settlement. Terrorist action as well as the actions of armies are forbidden, Mr. Eban said.

There is relief in Israel, but no joy, as the country prepares to bury its dead with the full military honors they deserve.
