Magen David, Unsung Hero

Jerusalem: --A great deal has been written about the bravery of the Israeli army which stemmed and threw back the massive invasion that swept across the frontiers on Yom Kippur.

Much has been said -- and understandably so -of the courage displayed by the people called upon to make every sacrifice demanded of it, including the offering up of its sons. Hospitals. welfare and fund raising organizations all met the challenge efficiently, a fact that their sizeable, hard working public relations, departments have been quick to point out.

But there is one unsung hero of the war whose name has been only rarely mentioned in the anglo-Jewish press, although it is (and I hesitate to use the expression) a household name in Israel. It is the Magen David Adom, the Red Magen David, Israel's Red Cross,

The role that it played in this last war, (or, more accurately, the present one, for it has not yet ended) like the role it has played in peace and war during the past 43 turbulent years, cries out for recognition.

As soon as the news of the outbreak of fighting reached the country at prayer, the MDA swung into action. Its emergency headquarters in Tel Aviv alerted each of the 59 branches throughout the country to stand by to render immediate assistance. Within two hours its 500 hundred volunteer workers who augment the small, regular staff were at their Nineteen thousand more Israelis rushed to offer their services, pleading to be given some role in the life saving activity of the MDA, foremost of which is the providing of blood for wounded soldiers and civilians.

Thanks to the provisions which had been made by the MDA, the army had on hand sufficient supplies from the MDA blood bank to meet its initial requirements. Additional supplies were immediately flown to the fronts. "Nor one soldier went without blood when he needed it," emphasizes Dr. Avraham Atzmon, the head of the MDA's National Emergency Committee.

"In a normal year." notes Dr. Atzmon, "we provide about 80,000 units for military and civilian use. With the outbreak of fighting, we were besieged by thousands of people from all walks of life lining up at our clinics and mobile stations to contribute blood, ranged in age from teen agers to octogenarians. business men, housewives, included workers, yeshiva students, and the like, Even prison inmates participated. It reflected the whole gamut of Israeli society. During the fighting from Oct. 6th until Oct. 24th, MDA provided 27,000 units. a figure that rose to 40,000 within a six week period. We had to turn away thousands of would-be donors and inform our overseas offices, which had provided an additional 40,000 units, not to accept any more blood,

Getting the blood to the wounded, and the wounded to hospitals kept MDA busy day and night. Its fleet of four hundred ambulances throughout the country (which continued to mainrain its regular service) was mobilized for the task. Refrigerated blood and plasma were rushed to waiting planes where they were immediately flown to the fronts. The ambulances stood by for the return run: transporting the wounded, who were brought back by plane, to hospitals which had been placed on a pre-planned war footing, where the staffs were awaiting the first arrivals.
