

LAS VEGAS ISRAELITE assaulted or even killed by addicrs, heap enthusiastic praise on Mr. Rockefeller. A smaller group, but perhaps just as vocal, cry out that society's real need anent the drug problem, is to rehabilitate drug addicts, not jail them for life or even years.

The current drug scene runs a long gamut of drama. When we talk of the problem today, we no longer concentrate on the flower children of Haight-Ashbury. This doesn't mean that young people have all kicked the habit. Pills are still popped, and marljuana and hashish continue in vogue on many campuses; but in the 1970s, preoccupation with drugs is not nearly as marked as it was in the 1960s.

One widely-publicized figure of days not long gone--Abbi Hoffman -- has been in the Tombs recently, unable to post large bail after his indictment on charges of selling cocaine to police undergover men. And oldtimers in poughkeepsie now recall that G. Gordon Liddy, convicted pacesetter of the Watergate burglars, liked to sniff out drug users when he was assistant district attorney in the Vassar area.

But these are side issues. Two new

considerations stand out: (1) President Nixon is authority for the recent statement that the nation has turned the corner on drug addiction; (2) Armed with the power to appoint up to 100 new judges to make the New York antidrug law effective, Governor Rockefeller may either prove to the country that harsh, harsher, and harshest sentences are the answer or else play into the hands of those who continue to argue that education, treatment for addiction, and rehabilitation must not be abandoned in favor or such a stern crackdown.

When he declared that the federal government has turned the corner in its war on drugs, President Nixon pointedly included education on the dangers of drug use,

The law Governor Rockefeller asked for and got provides for one to 15 years imprisonment for the sale of marijuana. A person convicted of selling LSD may end up in prison for life; anyone convicted of the unlawful sale of narcotics to boys or girls under 21 can have a 25-year sentence imposed on him. Some who know the drug picture most intimately contend that the New York law is cruel and vengeful. Charles Kenyetta, who served as bodyguard for Malcolm X, offers a sharper appraisal: unless the New York bill is repealed or at least modified, the measure will, he says, become New York's No. 1 cop killer. He adda; "When the police clamp down with an arrest that could lead to a life sentence, the dealer with money is going to hold court right there in the street. If he runs up on a cop who will not take graft, he's probably found one who will take lead instead.

So it is that the drug problem -- scarecly visible in America before World War II but a matter of unending concern to thousands of
