

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

MIAMI BEACH (WNS)--- "The United States must never permit oil blackmail to influence by one iota foreign policy in the Middle East," Rep. Ogden Reid (D. N.Y.) declared before 1200 delegates from the U.S. AND Canada attending the annual Histadrut Economic Conference.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Res. Gen. Meir Amit, president of the Histadrut-owned Koor Industries, Israel's largest industrial enterprise, said here that "major radical changes must take place" in Israel's leadership.

PARIS (WNS) -- France and Libya have signed an agreement providing for the continued sale of Libyan oil to France in exchange for French technical know-how, industrial help and the construction of an unspecified number of nuclear reactors.

JERUSALEM (WNS)---Plans for a world wide information campaign to counter massive anti-Israel propaganda were devised at a special four-day session of the Zionist General Council which was called to study post-Yom Kippur War problems.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- A record IL 36 billion pound budget has been approved by the Cabinet.

LOS ANGELES (WNS) -- Three Red Army Jewish veterans from Minsk who hold a total of 43 orders and medals, have condemned the expulsion of Soviet Nobel Laureate author Alexander Solzhenitsyn as "a manifestation of Stalinism in our time."

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- When the Senate Finance Committee begins hearings on the Trade Reform Act in March, the Nixon Administration will have five Cabinet members and two White House economic experts testifying for the bill and against the Jackson Amendment.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- "A large share" of the credit for the Suez disengagement accord is due "to the courage, goodwill and vision of leaders in both Egypt and Israel." Vice-President Gerald Ford told 1600 persons attending the 66th annual award dinner of the B'Nai Zion.

TEL AVIV (WNS)---The number of Israeli soldiers missing on the northern front, presumably prisoners in Syria, has been set at 80 by the Israeli army.

TEL AVIV (WNS) --Dr. Nahum Goldman, president of the World Jewish Congress, has warned that unless the detente between the U. S. and the Soviet Union is maintained there is a danger that no settlement will be reached in the Middle East and this means the possibility of a renewed war.

JERUSALEM (WNS)---In a reaction to the demand by the Islamic summit conference in Lahore for "the restoration of the holy city of Jerusalem to Arab sovereignty" Mayor Teddy Kollek repeated his conviction that Jerusalem should remain united as the capital of Israel.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Maj. Aharon Yariv, Israel's chief negotiator at Kilometer 101, drew record-breaking crowds at United Jewish Appeal meetings in Chicago, New York, and Los Angeles.

NEW YORK -- Emanuel Berlatsky, a long time social worker who has been in the Jewish Community Center field for over 44 years, is the winner of the 1974 Florence G. Heller Professional Award of the National Jewish Welfare Board.
