Israel has been receiving intelligence reports similar to those before the outbreak of the Yom Kippur War but this time they are being taken with utmost

seriousness, Minister, Defense Moshe Dayan, appearing on television said normal life on the Golan Heights would continue as long as there is no shooting, but noted that the Syrians are deployed in full strength along the cease-fire line. Israeli forces were also up to full strength,

As these events were going on Secretary of State Henry Kissinger telling a House Foreign Affairs Committee that he expected Israeli-Syrian disengagement talks "to star within about two weeks" in Washington.

At the United Nations, Sec'y General Kurt Waldheim told a press conference that the of United stationing Emergency Nations Force troops as a buffer berween Syrian and Israeli forces could only be decided upon after the disengagement talks are completed.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- After 10 hours of acrimonious debate, the Knesset approved Premier Golda Meir's new Cabinet by a 62-46

In her opening statement, Premier Meir disclosed that she had promised U.S. Sec'y of State Henry A. Kissinger to send a top level representative to the Syrian-Israeli disengagement talks in Washington.

Turning to the state of emergency on the Syrian front, Mrs. Meir said she hoped that the war would not be renewed but that if it came "I have no doubt of the outcome."

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- After several days of suspense over whether Premier Golda Meir would continue to try to form a government or let someone else try, the Premier submitted a new Cabinet list to President Ephraim Katzir.

The list included the two Rafi leaders, Defense Minister Moshe Dayan and Transport Minister Shimon Peres, who earlier had refused to serve in what would have been a minority government and instead had urged a national unity coalition which would include the opposition Likud. And it also appeared that Mrs. Meir would now have a majority government as the executive committee of the National Religious Party voted 30-17 to enter the Cabinet despite a ban by the Chief Rabbinate and the (Continued on Page 3)

"One Man Plus The Truth Constitutes A Majority'

interest in news stories about Howard Hughes is wearing thin, especially coming out of a civil court trial in another

But Sun publisher Hank Greenspun, who apparently has no trust in judges or lawyers. persists in a determination of trying the case in the newspapers, instead of the courtroom. Not satisfied with the International News Service, factual syndicated wire report, Greenspun has engaged a special writer, James Phelan, who's sole purpose apparently is to file stories discrediting Hughes. The first of two stories by Phelan started with the opening sentence: Evidence will be presented that it was Howard Hughes who systematically gave orders that he wanted to own every state senator, assemblyman, every judge, and every commissioner" in Nevada, a federal court jury was told here Friday. Phelan was quoting the lawyer for Robert Maheu, who is suing Hughes Tool Co. for \$17.3 million in a slander action.

Phelan's second story started: Billionaire Howard Hughes became "furious" when a top aide wanted a few days off to be with his wife during the birth of their fourth child. This information came from a sworn deposition by Maheu.

But INS and Philan are not enough for Greenspun, who, out of sheer decency and honest journalistic tenets, being a subpoenaed witness playing an integral role in the action, should refrain from commenting. Bringing dishonor to the newspaper profession and making himself the laughing stock of readers who follow his abortions of the truth, are not enough to discourage the publisher bent on discrediting Hughes.

Greenspun describes the departure of Hughes from Las Vegas on Thanksgiving, 1970, as strange -- even eerie.' Inere is nothing strange or eerie about this Hughes' departure, because the man who desires privacy has been making the same unheralded comings and goings all the time, to and from Nicaragua, Canada, London and the Bahamasi. There is something strange about Greenspun's attitude of Hughes' departure from Las Vegas compared with Greenspun's feelings when Hughes first came here four years earlier.

We recall on Hughes arrival at the Desert Inn, Greenspun accosted newspapermen seeking the story, and blasted them for depriving a man of his privacy.
