

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- An Israeli airforce plane went down over Mount Hermon and its two-man crew were seen to bail out into Lebanon as the fighting continued on the Syrian front. The Israeli military spokesman said the plane went down as a result of a mechanical mal-function. This was the first loss of an Israeli plane since the Yom Kippur war ended.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Israeli has released some 30 "security prisoners" from the Gaza Strip and Northern Sinai, who were jailed for subversive and sabotage activities, and allowed them and their families to go to Egypt.

TEL AVIV (WNS)--An 11-year-old-boy was killed and four persons injured when a mine exploded on a bus one minute before it reached its destination.

TEL AVIV (WNS)--Gen. David Elazar, who resigned as Chief of Staff, in a series of interviews with almost every Israeli newspaper has defended his actions against the charges in the Agranat Report. "I am no jurist and I have not yet consulted my lawyers," he said, "but my military common sense keeps telling me that a gross misjudgement has been done to me."

JERUSALEM (WNS)--Uzi Narkiss, director of the Jewish Agency's immigration and absorption department, has rejected as "contrary to reality" a public opinion poll finding that 10 percent of Israelis were contemplating emigration.

BOSTON (WNS) --- A policy evaluation committee for Boston's Jewish community has charged that United States policy in the Middle East is based on an illusory detente with the Soviet Union.

NEW YORK,--D.: Eugene V. Rostow, dean of the Yale Law School from 1955 to 1965 and now Sterling Professor of Law and Public Affairs there, has been appointed Director of Planning of the Touro School of Law, the first law school in the United States to be established under Jewish auspices.

NEW YORK: The destruction of the First and Second Temples of Jerusalem, the Spanish Inquisition, the anti-Jewish pogroms of Czarist Russia and the Nazi Holocaust are evocatively linked in a new edition of the biblical Book of Lamentations, illustrated by Mark Podwal and published by the National Council on Art in Jewish Life, 15 E. 84th St., N.Y.C., 10028.

LOS ANGELES: A new worldwide anti-Semitism, based on insensitivity and indifference to Jewish concerns, is the subject of "The New Anti-Semitism," an Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith report just published by McGraw Hill, according to Judge Robert Feinerman, president of the League's Pacific Southwest Regional Board, 590 No. Vermont Ave. Los Angeles, Calif. 90004.

NEW YORK---The retirement of Henry W. Levy (Hank) as Public Relations Director of the World Zionist Organization--American Section, as of March 31st, on reaching the organization's mandatory age of retirement was announced by Isadore Hamlin, Executive Director. DALLAS: After a hotly contested debate that lasted nearly two hours, the one thousand delegates to the B'nai B'rith Women International Triennial Convention adopted a controversial resolution on conditional amnesty for those who refused to fight in the war in Vietnam.

TEL AVIV (WNS)--The National Religious Party's Central Committee voted 296-198 with seven absentions to remain in Premier Golda Meir's coalition government despite bitter division within the party over the issue and strained relations, almost to a point of an open break, with Israel's Chief Rabbinate.

WASHINGTON (WNS)-- Cuban and North Korean forces may be serving alongside Syrian forces on the Golan Heights in addition to troops from other Arab states, Israeli Defense Minister Moshe Dayan said during an interview on NBC-TV "Meet the Press" program.

TEL AVIV (WNS) --Rejecting the view of "those who believe that peace is unattainable" with Egypt, Gen. David Elazar, Chief of Staff of Israel's armed forces, asserted that he is optimistic about an eventual peace settlement.

NEW YORK (WNS)--Israeli Defense Minister Moshe Dayan told 300 American Jewish leaders at a United Jewish Appeal meeting that never before in its 26 years of existence had Israel encountered "such a constructive attitude from the Arab people with regard to peace." Discussing Syria, Dayan noted that despite "the wide gap" between Israel's and Syria's basic positions on disengagement, the Syrians seem interested in an agreement.

NEW YORK -- Six panels of judges comprised of distinguished literary critics, authors and professors have been selected to choose the recipients of the 1974 National Jewish Book Awards, the highest recognition in American Jewish literature, will be presented by the Jewish Welfare Board Jewish Book Council at a special ceremony Sunday, May 5, 2 p.m., at the Park Avenue Synagogue, 50 East 87th Street, New York City.
