DETAILS OF TERRORIST MURDERS OF 18, 8 WERE CHILDREN, 15 WOUNDED

PREMIER GOLDA MEIR RESIGNS

JERUSALEM (WNS)—Premier Golda Meir has resigned after the Labor Party failed to end its factional dispute over whether Defense Minister Moshe Dayan should resign.

Her resignation came a month after she put a coalition government together and may bring about the scheduling of a new election unless all factions of the Labor Party and its coalition partners can agree upon a successor to Mrs. Meir.

Mrs. Meir made her announcement at a Labor Party meeting saying "I have reached the end of the road. I can not carry on any longer." She said her decision was not "linked to Dayan but to me personally." But her announcement came after hectic meetings of the various components of the Labor Party which sought a compromise to preserve the coalition government while meeting the demands, both within the Labor Alignment and from the opposition Likud, for Dayan's resignation over Israel's unprepar-

edness for the Yom Kippur War.

In her resignation speech to the Knesset, Mrs. Meir said that since the recent elections "I have been watching closely developments in the country and I have reached the conclusion that there is a public unrest which cannot be avoided" and that the public should have an opportunity to study the possibility of a new government. She stressed that while the government was resigning, the interim gov't would be capable of handling the situation and the army was prepared to cope with all challenges. She called on the nation "to behave not like a stricken people but like a people with a future open before it."

Meanwhile the various grass roots protest movements that have built up in reaction to the Yom Kippur War have come together into one organization and selected Yocha Bin Noon, a former naval commander and national hero as its leader.

BRAD FRIEDMAN BAR MITZVAH

KIRYAT SHEMONA (WNS) -- Three terrorists invaded this town near the Lebanese border and killed 18 people -- eight of them children -- and wounded 15 others--including two policemen, three border patrol guards and three soldiers -- during a four-hour rampage with machineguns, bazookas and grenades before they were killed by Israeli security forces.

The terrorists belonged to a group calling itself "The Popular Front -- The General Command" headed by Ahmed Jabril with headquarters in Beirut, the same gang which claimed it had slaughtered children in a school bus near Avivim three years ago.

At least two of the dead were soldiers, the rest mostly women and children who were mowed down by automatic fire or grenades. Several soldiers were among the wounded. Considerable damage was done to buildings in the town.

Defense Minister Moshe Dayan rushed to the scene by helicopter from a Cabinet meeting (Continued on Page 3)

Terror and Diplomacy

The basic problem in a final and just solution to a lasting peace in the Middle East is the proper and satisfactory disposition of the Palestinians.

Despite Russia's most recent pact with Syria and Egypt's threats to re-open military aggression, diplomacy, it is hoped, or further war fare, if necessary, will bring some settlement among the nations. But nothing will be final until the Palestinians are given suitable status in the Arab world.

The Palestinians are those Arabs who elected to leave what was then Palestine, when Israel was recognized as a nation in 1948. Upon crossing the newly formed borders, they were not permitted to pass into and become residents and citizens of the Arab lands. Instead they were herded into compounds and forced to live unproductive existence, supported by the United Nations and other agencies. They numbered in estimation from one to several million.

In time, when the second generation grew into adulthood, Palestinians became bitter, more aggressive and more demanding, both against Israel, which they persist in their homeland, and the Arab leaders, who refused to recognize their rights and status.

Thus was born the terrorists, spreading havoc against innocent, non-combatants mainly women and children.

There is much, much more to the Palestinian problem, which is as complex as it is obscure. But it is a problem recognized moreso by Israel and the Jews of the world than by the Arab leaders.

WHO SPEAKS FOR THE PALESTINIANS?

Thursday morning's attack by three heavily armed Palestinian terrorists, who sneaked across the Lebanon-Israel frontier and killed perhaps a dozen Israeli men, women and children before being killed themselves, has again horrified a world longing for an end to bloodshed in the Middle East.

At the same time, this new atrocity points up the difficulties that stand in the way of resolving the complex problem of the Palestinians and their national aspirations.

In recent months, there have been increased pressures from the Arab world to have the Palestinians officially represented at the forth-
