Spirit of Resistance

The recent observance of the 31st anniversary of the Warsaw Ghetto Uprising serves to remind Jews everywhere of one of the most courageous and noble chapters in their history. It was also a day to remember and honor the memory of the six million Jews who were the victims of Nazi barbarism.

But most important of all it was a time to renew our vow to be vigilant against any future holocaust. The world was either silent or too passive during the Nazi period and this attitude seems to be burgeoning again today. There was no great outcry by the governments of the world as Jews went to their death when the Arabs attacked Israel on Yom Kippur, when 18 men, women and children were massacred at Kiryat Shemona or to any of the other terrorist atrocities during the last several years.

The holocaust was able to occur in part because Jews were weak, defenseless and disunited, and because some nations surreptitiously supported Hitlerism. But with the creation of Israel these three elements are gone and a new situation exists. Today Jews throughout the world are united around an Israel able to defend itself.

The Nazis, like all of the enemies of the Jews, tried not only to destroy the Jews physically but to break their spirit. When German soldiers entered the Warsaw Ghetto on Passover eve 1943 they thought that spirit was broken and they could easily finish off the Jews. But instead they were met with resistance that lasted for 42 days. The fighters of the Warsaw Ghetto demonstrated that the Jewish spirit could not be broken. The fighters for Israel's existence have and continue to show this same spirit. And we in the American Jewish community must also participate in that spirit of resistance.

elements of the new Haggadah reflected a greater deference to traditionalism. The book opens from the right, the plagues have been reintroduced, there's more Hebrew, etc.

The Haggadah also contains some original and quoted literary gems. The spirit of Rabbi Bronstein, an earnest student of his faith, is well distilled in the Haggadah, which reflects also the influence of the rabbi's late father-inlaw, Rabbi Samuel Blumenfield, one of the great Hebreists of our epoch.

The Times reporter, Eleanor Blau, also spoke to the great Baskin. And what did he tell her? He told her that though he was the son of an Orthodox rabbi he wasn't an observant Jew.

Now why in the world would Baskin say a thing like that? Here he has helped produce a tome involved in a Jewish observance, but the readers of the Times learn that he himself is not interested in the faith the book will How condescending, how indifferent serve. can you get?

If the man isn't devout, couldn't he have kept that to himself? Why, of all the facts he could have told the reporter did he have to choose that thing, which brings embarr-assment to Jews, to the Central Conference, and not only to the memory of his father but to his very much living brother, Rabbi Bernard Baskin, a Reform rabbi of Hamilton, Ontario, whom the Times article doesn't mention? And a sweeter person than Rabbi Baskin you'll not find.

If you see Leonard Baskin, tell him for me, please: talented you are, but smart you're not.
